## Russia in Brief

## Geography

Russia is the world's biggest country with its vast territory that occupies the east of Europe and the north of Asia, i.e. 11.46% of the Earth's land area. The total area of Russia is 17,098,200 square kilometers. It stretches almost ten thousand kilometers from east to west and four thousand kilometers from north to south.

## Climate

The climate in Russia varies from subtropical on the Black Sea coast to continental in Southern Siberia, as well as from subarctic in the Far North to maritime on the Baltic Sea and to moderately monsoon in the southern part of the Far East. The most densely populated part of Russia's territory lies within the moderate climatic zone.

## Population, Ethnicity and Language

Population: 143 million people (2012).

Ethnicity: Russia is a multi-ethnic country with 150 different nationalities.

Language: Russian is the official language throughout the country; 47 others are co-official languages in various regions.

## Religion

The majority of the Russian people are Orthodox Christians, but there are also many Muslims, Catholics, Hebrews and Buddhists.

## Republic of Tatarstan in Brief

## Geography

The Republic of Tatarstan is situated in the heart of the Russian Federation on the East European Plain at the confluence of two great rivers - the Volga and Kama. The total area of the Republic is 67,836.2 sq. km. The territory of the Republic extends over 290 km from north to south and 460 km from west to east. Tatarstan has no borders with foreign states.

## Climate

The climate is moderate-continental. Droughts are occasional. The average temperature of the coldest month (January) is -14°C, and of the warmest month (July) is +19°C. The annual average amount of precipitation is 460-520 mm.

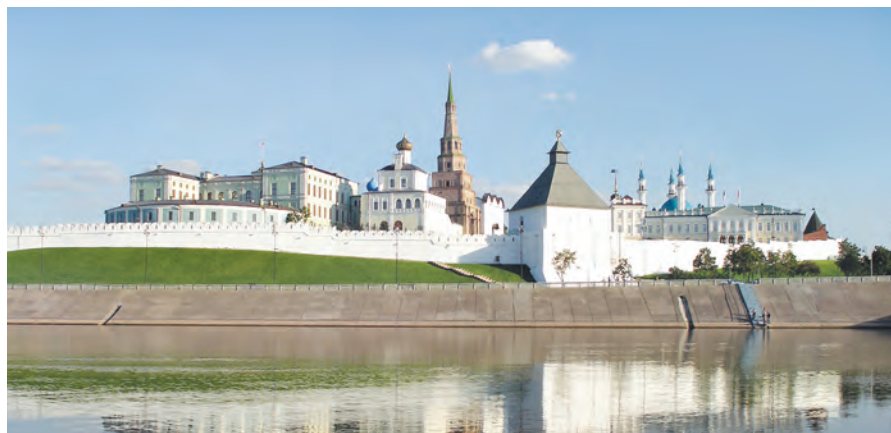

## Kazan City in Brief

The capital of the Republic of Tatarstan Kazan lies in the north-western portion of Tatarstan along the banks of the Kazanka River at its confluence with the Volga River. It has a population of 1,161,308 people (2012).



The capital of Tatarstan is a big railway, motorway and airway hub and one of the largest river ports on the Volga.

Main industries include machine engineering and metalwork, aircraft construction and instrument engineering, petro-chemistry, textile and food processing.

Kazan is also a large science and research Centre. The Kazan (Volga region) Federal University, the second oldest university in the Russian Federation, was established in 1804. Altogether Kazan has 39 higher education establishments, the Tatarstan Academy of Sciences, the Kazan Scientific Centre of the Russian Academy of Sciences and several science and research institutions.

Kazan is a multi-faith city. The main religions are Islam and Orthodox Christianity. The other traditional religious communities are represented by Judaism, Catholicism and Lutheranism. There are mosques, Orthodox churches, Lutheran and Catholic churches, a synagogue, a theological seminary and Russian Islamic University in Kazan.

The recent years have seen large-scale construction resulting in the new transport infrastructure and many new sport venues being put up.

In 2009 Kazan was named "The Sports Capital of Russia". In Russian, European and world competitions Kazan is represented by the Hockey Club Ak Bars, Football Club Rubin-Kazan, Basketball Club UNICS, Dinamo-Kazan bandy team, Volleyball Club Zenit-Kazan and others.

Kazan is one of Russia's leading tourist attractions and receives more than one million

guests a year. Fifteen new hotels were opened here over the last five years, with ten more being constructed.

The city where representatives of various faiths and ethnic backgrounds live in harmony and peace welcomes guests from around the world.

### Climate

Kazan has a moderate continental climate with long cold winters and warm, often hot dry summers. The warmest month is July with a daily mean temperature near +20 °C (68 °F), the coldest month is January with –12 °C (10 °F).

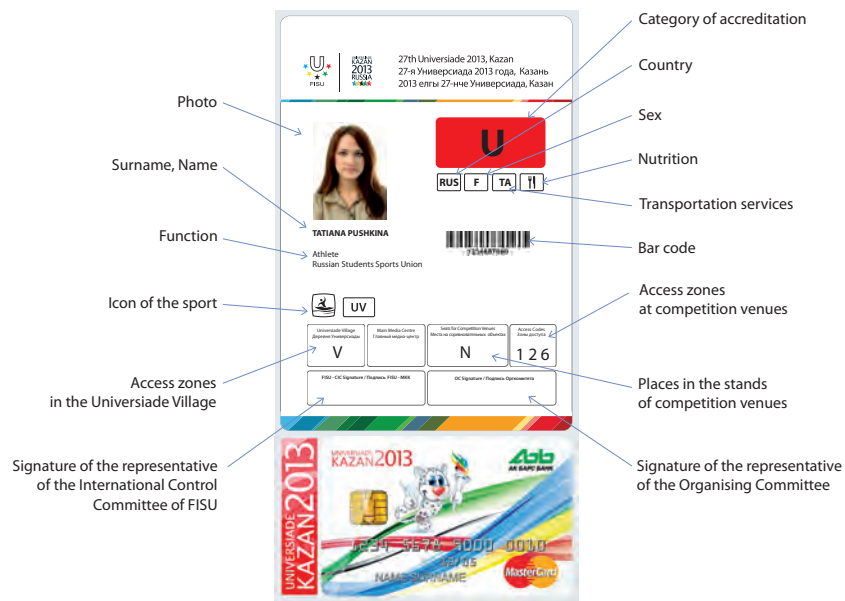
## Service Information

### Accreditation

The Main Accreditation Centre is located on the premises of the Universiade Village in the Main International Centre and is planned only for members of delegations. Technical officials (accompanying referees and judges) will be accredited at "Kazanskaya Yarmarka", Exhibition Centre, Pavilion N 1 (8 Orenburgskiy Trakt).

The Main Accreditation Center will provide services 24 hours a day from June 28 to July 21, 2013.

The accreditation badge is an official document jointly issued by FISU and the Organising Committee. The accreditation badge will be issued after the completion of accreditation procedures. The accreditation badge contains two parts: the accreditation card and the access card placed in a plastic pocket.



The accreditation badge is valid only together with the access card. Any misuse of the accreditation badge and the access card (using cards separately, passing them over to other persons, efforts to fake the cards, and etc.) causes cancellation of the accreditation badge.

The accreditation badge is intended for personal use only and may not be passed on to other people.

The access card enables the cardholder to pass through the check points outside the Universiade venues. The access card is equipped with the Pay Pass technology, facilitating the use of transport and bank applications.

### Lost or damaged accreditation badges

In case the accreditation badge is lost or damaged, please immediately report to the Accreditation Centre. It will take 24 hours for the written request to be processed and for the accreditation badge to be replaced. The participant will be provided with a temporary pass during this period of time. The replacement of a damaged or lost card is charged with a fee in the amount of 50 Euros.

### Transportation

#### Transportation for athletes and delegation officials

The transportation system for athletes and members of official delegations will provide transport services from 00:00 June 29 until 23:59 July 20, 2013.

#### Transportation upon arrival and departure

Regular bus service will be arranged to provide transportation from the "Kazan" International Airport and railway stations "Kazan-1" and "Kazan-2" to the Universiade Village in order to ensure transportation of athletes, members of official delegations, baggage and sporting equipment. The service will operate from 00:00 June 29 until 23:59 July 20, 2013.

#### Transportation to the Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The Opening and Closing Ceremonies will be held at the "Kazan Arena" Stadium. Transportation will be provided to take athletes and members of official delegations to the Opening/Closing Ceremonies on the days of these events from the Universiade Village to the "Kazan Arena" Stadium.

#### Transportation for Delegation as spectators

Spectator transportation will be available from July 5 until the end of the competitions. Athletes and delegation officials will be offered to use shuttle buses designated for attending the sporting events as spectators.

#### Transport services for Delegations by allocated cars

According to the FISU requirements the Organising Committee will provide delegations with allocated transportation and drivers depending on the number of participants:

## Accommodation

The Universiade Village was built in Kazan to provide accommodation for athletes and members of the official delegations at the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan. The residential area of the Universiade Village incorporates 28 residential buildings, grouped into three clusters. The Universiade Village is located in the Privolzhskiy District of Kazan. It is shaped like a large rectangle, with the following streets around its sides: Akademika Parina St., Mavlyutova St., Prospekt Pobedy and Orenburgskiy Trakt.

The Universiade Village will be opened on June 29, 2013.

The Universiade Village check-in procedure for delegates will commence on June 29, 2013.

Extra officials will be accommodated in Kazan hotels, located outside the Universiade Village.

The Universiade Village is divided into two functional zones: the residential zone and the international zone.

### International zone

The international zone incorporates the Main International Centre, the Universiade Village Polyclinic and parking areas.

Within the Main International Centre one can find the following: the Main Accreditation Centre, the CIC and FISU offices, Heads of Delegation meeting rooms, the Sports Information Centre, the Main Information Centre, auditoriums for video presentations, conference rooms, a religious centre, the FISU International Educational Centre, souvenir shop, a fitness centre, a bank office and a post office.

### Residential zone

The residential area of the Universiade Village contains residential buildings, the Main Dining Hall, the Universiade Village ceremonial stage, the Flags Alley, souvenir shop, a supermarket, a beauty salon, the Universiade Village cultural venue as well as some essential services (a bank, a post office, etc.).

The Universiade participants will be accommodated in one-, two-, three -, and four-bed rooms. Each room is equipped with cable Internet. Free Wi-Fi Internet is provided in the halls/lobbies of all residential buildings.

In addition to guest rooms, the residential buildings in the Universiade Village also house delegation offices, storage facilities, medical stations, launderettes, video auditoriums, ice-machine rooms, and spare offices.

## Catering

During the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan the Main Dining Hall in the Universiade Village will operate 24 hours a day. Catering services will be provided to the delegations upon presentation of an accreditation badge.

The capacity of the Main Dining Hall is 3,510 seats.

### Menu

There will be five cuisines offered in the Main Dining Hall:

European/Mediterranean – 52%  
Asian – 14%  
Russian/ Tatar – 12%  
Muslim – 12%  
Vegetarian – 10%.

Athletes' daily menu will consist of main and second course dishes, side dishes, appetisers and salads, baked goods, and also desserts and fruit.

Food service counters offering all these cuisines will be available daily between 5:00 and 2:00. Considering that in 2013 the Holy month of Ramadan will take place in July (09.07.13 – 08.08.13), Halal food will be available in the Main Dining Hall from the start of the fasting period, not only during the day but also during night-time hours, from 2:00 – 4:30. The only food available in the Main Dining Hall during the night-time hours shown above will be Halal food.

A McDonald's fast food outlet will be located in the Main Dining Hall to offer the delegations alternative meals.

The Coca-Cola Company is the official sponsor of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan and the main supplier of refrigerating equipment, water and beverages for all client groups during the Universiade.

Free Coca-Cola products will be available at all sports venues, the Main Dining Hall and the lobbies of the residential buildings of the Universiade Village.

### Lunch boxes ordering procedure for athletes and officials

Lunch boxes may be ordered at the information desk in the Main International Centre from 7:00 to 20:00 at least 12 hours before the lunch box is to be delivered.

Lunch box order forms may be filled in by delegation officials or attachés, in accordance with the standard form, in two copies, one of which remains with the customer whilst the other is kept at the information desk.

The customer can choose between three types of lunch box, by indicating the preferred option on the Order form. The number of lunch boxes must also be indicated, as well as the delivery date, time and place.



## Medical Services

Accredited persons can receive free medical care only during the Summer Universiade 2013. All delegations' members must have individual health insurance.

During the Summer Universiade 2013 the consolidated Call Centre (8 800 550 2013) is in operation. All the necessary information on medical and sanitary-epidemiological support is available at the above indicated number.

The Summer Universiade 2013 has been proclaimed a smoking free event. Smoking is strictly banned at all the Universiade venues.

### Medical services in the Universiade Village

Medical services in the Universiade Village is provided by medical staff of the Polyclinic of the Universiade Village. Detailed information on the Polyclinic can be found in the Heads of Delegation Manual.

### Emergency medical assistance

If necessary, participants and guests of the Universiade may get in touch with Call Centre (8 800 550 2013) and call an ambulance.

### Medical services at competition and training venues

At the competition venues during the competition time medical assistance is provided by a mobile medical brigade, a medical station for athletes and a medical station for spectators.

At the training venues during the training time medical assistance is provided by a mobile medical brigade and in a medical station.

At each competition and training venue there is a 24-hour operating ambulance service, which in case of emergency, is to take injured or ill participants to hospital.

## Competition information

### Technical Committee

In accordance with Article 3.5.1 of the Regulations for the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan, there shall be a Technical Committee (CT) for each sport in the Universiade programme.

No more than two (2) members of the CT should be of the same nationality, not including the FISU Technical Delegate(s).

### Technical Regulations

The Athletics competition shall be conducted in accordance with the Regulations for the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan:

- 11.1** The sports events of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade in Kazan 2013 shall be organised in accordance with the most recent technical rules of the appropriate ISFs unless otherwise stated by the Executive Committee.
- 12.1.1** The athletics events will be organised in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of these rules, the English text will be regarded as authoritative.
- 12.1.2** The programme and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the Executive Committee in agreement with the Organising Committee and the CTI-UE. In principle, the programme shall last six (6) days and include the following events:

#### Men

100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1,500 m, 5,000 m and 10,000 m  
20 km walk, half marathon individual and team classification  
Hurdles: 110 m and 400 m  
3,000 m steeplechase





Relays: 4 x 100 m and 4 x 400 m  
 Jumps: high, pole vault, long and triple  
 Throws: shot-put, discus, hammer and javelin  
 Decathlon

### Women

100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1,500 m, 5,000 m and 10,000 m  
 20 km walk, half marathon individual and team classification  
 Hurdles: 100 m and 400 m  
 3,000 m steeplechase  
 Relays: 4 x 100 m and 4 x 400 m  
 Jumps: high, pole vault, long and triple  
 Throws: shot-put, discus, hammer and javelin  
 Heptathlon

#### 12.1.3 Each country is authorised to enter in:

- a. Individual event: two (2) athletes both of whom have achieved the entry standard for the event in the year before the Universiade or one (1) athlete who has not achieved the entry standard;
- b. Team event: one (1) team;
- c. For 10,000 m men and women, a maximum of three (3) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the Universiade or two (2) who have not achieved the entry standard;
- d. For the half-marathon and 20 km walk for men and women, a maximum of five (5) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the Universiade or three (3) who have not achieved the entry standard;
- e. Each delegation entering a race walk or half-marathon team shall take part with a minimum of (three (3) and maximum of five (5) athletes;
- f. The times of the first 3 (three) finishing athletes of each team shall be aggregated in order to determine the finishing order, the team with the lowest aggregate time being the winner, and so on;
- g. A tie shall be resolved in favour of the team whose last scoring athlete finishes nearest to the first place;
- h. All athletes finishing shall be classified individually and shall be eligible for individual awards;
- i. A team finishing with less than three (3) athletes will not be classified in the team result.

Before the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors at the Technical Information Center (TIC) or at the Main Sports Information Centre latest **by 12:00 of July 5.**

#### 12.1.4 The minimum qualification standards for track and field events shall be agreed by the FISU Executive Committee.

#### 12.1.5 The most recent performances of the participants must be clearly indicated on the individual entry form.

#### 12.1.6 International technical officials are nominated and selected by the CT Chairs in collaboration with IAAF. Travel expenses, full board, accommodation and the per diem according to the ISF rules and regulations are to be borne by the Organising Committee.

## Participation

All athletes must satisfy the following conditions:

- (1) be a national of the country they represent;
- (2) be at least 17 and less than 28 years of age on January 1, 2013 (born between 1985 and 1995);
- (3) students who are currently officially registered as preceding towards a degree or diploma at the university or similar institute whose status are recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;
- (4) former students of the institutions mentioned in (3) who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the Universiade.

In countries with fewer than 2,000,000 inhabitants or having fewer than 5,000 University students, students attending technical or secondary schools may participate in the Universiade provided they have been attending their establishments for at least two years. Such countries/regions must submit an application to the FISU Executive Committee at least six months before the scheduled start of the event. Such an application must be supported by documents endorsed by the appropriate State, Regional or National Academic Authorities.

### Entry Procedures

Entries will be accepted only from those organisations which have been invited to participate. All delegations shall submit the entry forms to the Organising Committee and FISU in the due time and in the form prescribed by the Organising Committee and FISU regulations.

Intention of participation, General and Nominative entries may be sent by email or fax in order to meet the required entry deadlines, but they must be confirmed as soon as possible in writing, on the official forms. Entries arriving after the expiration of the required deadlines will not be taken into consideration, except in the case of circumstances outside one's control, with the agreement of the Executive Committee and on the advice of the Organising Committee.

Individual entry forms of athletes from a non-member association must be countersigned by the NSF or by the NOC, and stamped with a seal from the said organisation.

## Sport Entries

All the athletes competing in the Universiade must have the FISU and IAAF eligibility and the nationality of the country they represent. Please refer to appendices for **ENTRY STANDARDS (Appendix №1)**.

Only students (Art 5.2, Regulation for 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013) being at least 17 and less than 28 years of age on January 1, 2013 (born 1985-1995) may take part in the competition.

Individual Entry Forms (Final entries) must be submitted for each athlete with all the necessary information including the athlete's full name, date of birth, season best and personal best performances.

Individual Entry Forms by names must be submitted not later than **June 6, 2013 at 24:00**.

Participating teams in athletics must submit photos of their competition uniform on a USB stick before the 1<sup>st</sup> General Technical Meeting in the TIC or send it by e-mail to athletic@kazan2013.com.

### Final confirmation

Forms for the final declaration and confirmation will be distributed to each delegation during accreditation, and must be completed and submitted to the Technical Information Centre (TIC) in the Central Stadium (**Appendix №7**).

Before the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors at the Technical Information Center (TIC) or at the Main Sports Information Centre latest by **12:00 of July 5**.

The final confirmation of the entries for the first day of the competitions is July 5, 2013 at 12:00 in the TIC.

Delegations must confirm the entries of their athletes for all other events no later than at 9:00 on the day prior to the day of the first round of the relevant event at the TIC.

### Relays

Names of athletes in relay teams in running order must be submitted to the TIC no later than 60 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the first heat. (IAAF rule 170.11). Justified changes due to injury, illness or other uncontrollable matter will be possible until the beginning of the respective events, if approved by the Technical Delegate. Once the event has begun, only two substitutes may be used.

### Withdrawal

Withdrawal of any confirmation must be indicated to the TIC at the Stadium in writing on the official withdrawal form.

The Stadium includes the following competition sites:

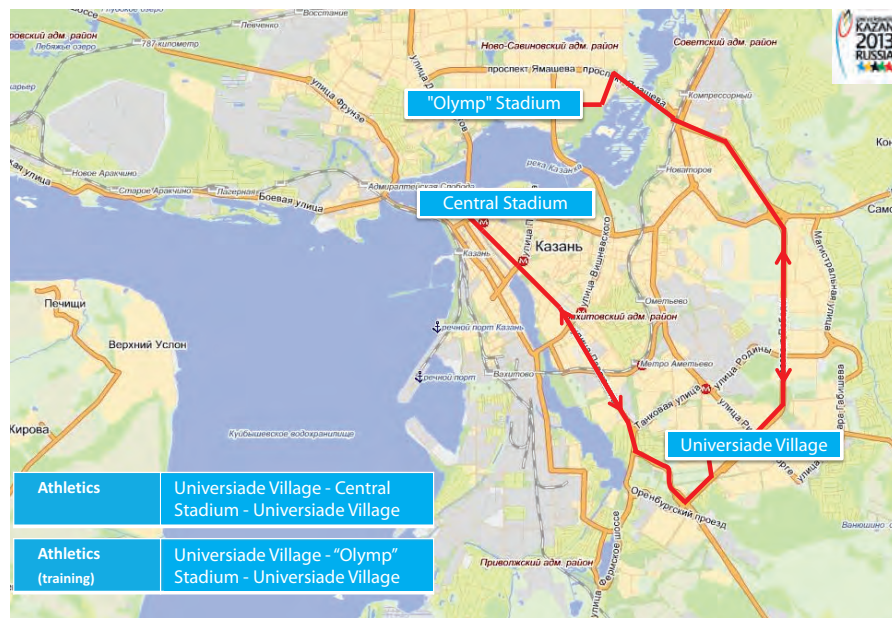
- 8 lanes track of 400 m with 9 lanes at the home straight in the west;
- 2 High Jump Sites (simultaneous jumping possible);
- 2 Pole Vault Sites (possible jumping in both directions);
- 2 Long Jump/Triple Jump Sites (possible jumping in both directions);
- 2 Shot Put Circles;
- 1 Combined Discus and Hammer Throw Circles;
- 2 Javelin Throw Runways.

Track and Runways are covered with "Mondo" synthetic surface.

## Stadium Competitions

### Track Events

The rounds of competition will be arranged in accordance with IAAF rules 166.1 - 8 and be decided according to the number of participants after the closing date for entries.

### Field Events

The qualifying standards for the finals will be decided by the Technical Committee. Twelve (12) athletes or over twelve who all have reached the qualifying standard will be allowed to enter into the Final. If the number of athletes who have reached the qualifying standard is less than twelve, the twelve athletes with the best results enter into the Final. The starting heights and the successive height of the bars for the High Jump and Pole Vault will be decided by Technical Committee and will be announced at the 1<sup>st</sup> General Technical Meeting.

### Combined Events

The men Decathlon consists of ten events which will be held in two consecutive days in the following order:

First day - 100 m, Long Jump, Shot Put, High Jump, 400 m.

Second day - 110 m Hurdles, Discus Throw, Pole Vault, Javelin Throw, 1,500 m.

The women Heptathlon consists of 7 events which will be held on two consecutive days in the following order:

First day - 100 m Hurdles, High Jump, Shot Put, 200 m.

Second day - Long Jump, Javelin Throw, 800 m.

The scoring will be according to IAAF Scoring table for Combined Events, latest edition (2001).

## Road Events

### The Half Marathon (women and men)

The Half Marathon course will have three laps of 5 km and a final lap of 6 km and 97.5 m. The distance in kilometres shall be displayed to all athletes.

The runners must report to the Call Room located in the Central Stadium Track and Field Hall 30 minutes before the start and athletes must report to the start line 10 minutes prior to the event.

The transponders (bib numbers with transponder system chips) will be distributed at the Call Room tents right before the start.

Refreshment stations shall be provided at approximately every 5 km as indicated on the route diagram and drinking/sponging stations only for water will be placed at 1.5 km, and 3 km.

**The personal refreshment** must be handed to the TIC on the day before the events (on July 11) by 20:00 with clearly displaying the following information: athlete's bib number, 3 letter code of the country abbreviation, the refreshment point (km) where the refreshment has to be handed out.

The OC will provide for refreshment water, isotonic beverages, sugar.

Drinking/sponging station will be provided with water and sponges.

It is prohibited to receive food or drinks that are not supplied by the refreshment stations.

First aid stations will be at the start and 2.5 km.

One ambulance cars will be located at start, 2.5 km and 3.5 km.

The toilets (WC) will be situated along the race and will be clearly identified.

### 20 km Walk Event (women and men)

The 20 km Walk Event shall be held also in close proximity of the main stadium, the Central Stadium (Appendix № 6), and will have 20 laps of 1 km each.

The athletes must report to the Call Room located in the Central Stadium 30 minutes before the start and athletes must report to the start line 10 minutes prior to the event. The transponders (bib numbers with transponder system chips) will be distributed at the Call Room tents right before the start. Posting boards shall be placed on the course to keep athletes informed about the number of Red cards for each athlete.

Refreshment stations and drinking/sponging stations only for water shall be provided at each lap as indicated on the route diagram.

**The personal refreshment** must be handed to the TIC on the day before the events (on July 8 for men and on July 9 for women) by 20:00 with clearly displaying the following information: athlete's bib number, 3 letter code of the country abbreviation, the refreshment point (km) where the refreshment has to be handed out.

The OC will provide for refreshment water, isotonic beverages, sugar.

Drinking/sponging station will be provided with water and sponges.

It is prohibited to receive food or drinks that are not supplied by the refreshment stations.

The ambulance car will be placed at the point of lap turning to the Circus.



## Technical Information Centre (TIC)

The Technical Information Centre (TIC) is located on the first floor of the grand stand in the Central Stadium and will be operated from July 3 to July 12, 2013:

- Voluntary doping control requests;
- National Record Photo Finish Print requests;
- Personal Refreshment Deposit and Storage for Road Events;
- Recovery of confiscated items in the Call room.

Notice-boards for start lists and results will be in front of the TIC.

In the TIC, each delegation will have a pigeon hole assigned where all necessary information will be posted.

Specific permit cards for passing to the Coaching Zones will be issued to coaches of athletes participating in field events.

**Access Areas for Teams:** All team accreditation cards will allow access to the team tribune, warm-up and training areas. Only athletes who are about to compete will have access to the call room and to the infield. Furthermore, the accreditation can be used to access the Team Shuttle Buses and will be required at the Team Hotels restaurants.

Separate cards will be issued for access to the Coaching Zones, Mixed Zone, TIC (access to the information in the pigeon boxes), Medical Centres, Doping Control Station and Combined Events Rest Room. All special cards will be handed out at the TIC. The Coaching Zones and Combined Events Rest Room cards will be available at the TIC the previous day to the respective event. The TIC access card will be handed out together with the team accreditations at the Team Accreditation Centre.

**Access to the Doping Control:** the doping control pass will be given to the athlete upon notification. The doping control pass for the athlete's representative will be given in the TIC in case an athlete is chaperoned to the Doping Control Station without his representative. Passes will be collected once the team member enters the Medical Centre.

**Access to the Medical Centre:** the pass can be requested in the TIC in case an athlete is injured and escorted to one of the Medical Centres. Passes will be collected once the team member enters the Medical Centre.

## Training Sites

All training sessions (except discus, hammer and javelin throwing) shall be held at the Universiade Village Stadium. The stadium possesses eight oval tracks, four long and triple jumping sectors, and two sectors for high jumping, two sectors for pole vaults and a sector for shot put. The tracks and sectors are covered with the synthetic track "Mondo".

Tents for pre-start preparation, a medical station and boxes for athletic training clothes are located along the eastern straight of the stadium. A storage room for sport outfit and inventory is situated in the southern part of the stadium.

Training sessions for discus, hammer and javelin throwing shall be held on the field for long throwing of the Central Stadium. Training areas are equipped with the inventory certified by IAAF and fully identical to the competition equipment.

All training sessions shall be held in the company of referees and according to a training schedule (**Appendix №4**).

**Venue Inspection Visits**

The tour will provide the Team Leaders with an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the athletes flow and the exact location of key areas of the Central Stadium. (There is no training allowed during this inspection.)

Training with the official starters will be on July 4 from 15:00 – 18:00 at the Central Stadium followed by a rehearsal meeting of approximately 60 ~ 90 minutes.

Venue inspection for the road events are scheduled:

- to the race walking course - at 12:00 on July 8, 2013;
- to the half-marathon course - at 11:00 on July 11, 2013.

The departure to visit the 20 km race walk course and the half-marathon course will begin from the transport drop off point of the Central Stadium. Please refer to the TIC for more detailed information.

**The 1<sup>st</sup> General Technical Meeting**

The 1<sup>st</sup> General Technical Meeting shall be held at 17:00 on July 5, 2013 at the Main International Centre of the Universiade Village. No more than two representatives from each delegation (if necessary plus an attaché or an interpreter) may attend the meeting.

The meeting will be conducted in English with simultaneous translation (French and Russian).

The FISU technical delegates will preside over the 1<sup>st</sup> General Technical Meeting.

**The agenda:**

- Welcome by the FISU President or his representative;
- Welcome by the Organising Committee President or his representative;
- Introduction of the FISU and IAAF delegates and Main Competition Officials of the Universiade track-and-field events;
- Timetable;
- Qualifying Rounds for races;
- Qualifying Distances for field events;
- Starting heights and raising the bar;
- Road Events Procedures;
- Warm-up and pre-start preparation zones;
- Call Room Procedures;
- Order of finishing;
- Protests/appeals;
- Doping control;
- Award ceremony;
- Answers to Delegations' Written Questions.

**The Written Questions**

Questionnaire forms are available from accreditation or the TIC and have to be returned to the TIC by 12:00 of July 5, 2013 at the latest. All questions may be made in either English or French.

**Call Room Procedures**

The Call Room 1 is located in the Central Stadium Track and Field Hall. The Call Room 2 is located at the territory of the Central Stadium close to the Call Room 1.

All competitors must arrive to the Call Room 1 according to the call room time schedule. The Call Room time shall be also announced by radio announcing system and shown on a video display in the warm-up zone.

It is the responsibility of the team leaders to ensure that their athletes are aware of the last check-in times for entry to the Call Room 1. Athletes arriving late may be excluded from participation in the event.

Coaches, team officials, physiotherapists and team physicians are not allowed into the Call Room.

**Combined Events Athletes**

All athletes participating in the Combined events must report to the Call Room 1 at the start of each day. For subsequent events, they shall report to the Combined Events Rest Area (Appendix №7.) located at the 1<sup>st</sup> floor to the right from the central entrance of the Stadium, where they may rest between the events. The Combined Events Rest Area will be considered as the Call Room 2 for all subsequent events on that day. The athletes are not required to stay in the Combined Events Rest Area for the entire day, but are required to report to this area before the start of each event to undergo their final check. Toilet and shower facilities will be available and the OC shall provide fruit, energy bars and drinks.

Access to the Combined Events Rest Area will be limited to athletes and up to two (2) other accredited persons per athlete (coaches, doctor, etc.) who are in possession of the Combined Events Rest Area Pass. These passes will be distributed at the TIC in the Central Stadium before the start of the Combined Events competition.

The competitors move from the Call Room 1 to the Call Room 2 accompanied by a referee.

**Call times**

Call Room 2 is the last checkpoint before competition. From the Call Room 2 the athletes will be escorted to the competition site to be there according to the following schedule:

**Note: Those times may be changed for qualifying due to the number of entries.**

### Call Room Procedure

The procedure of registration shall be the following:

The competitors will be invited to the Call Room 1 in compliance with the schedule and call room officials shall register them according to the official starting protocol. Then the competitors, accompanied by referees, move to the Call Room 2 to continue prestart check-in.

Judges will check the following in accordance with IAAF Rules:

- Competition Bibs (Competition rule 143.7);
- Shoes and Spikes (Competition rule 143.2 - 6);
- Uniforms (Competition rule 143.1);
- Bags (identification on and content);
- Any other kind of advertising.

Refreshments (still water) and toilets will be available close to the both Call Rooms. Coaches, team officials, physiotherapists and team physicians are not allowed into the Call Room.

Personal belongings (video cameras, tape recorders, radios, CD players, radio transmitters, MP3/MP4, cell phones or similar devices) will not be permitted in the infield as per IAAF Rule 144.2. Competition officials in the Call Room 2 will confiscate all items not authorized by IAAF Regulations. Athletes will receive a receipt for any such items. Upon presentation of this receipt, the athletes will be able to collect such items in the Post Event Area once their event has finished. Items, which were not collected at the end of the day, will be transported to the TIC.

A detailed list of Call Room times will be handed out at the TIC of the Stadium day by day. Team Leaders must inform all their athletes about the times at which they must report in the Call Room 1 and on the procedures to be followed in the Call Room 2. Accreditation passes will be collected by call room officials and will be returned at the Post Event Control Centre.

Athletes may only leave the Call Room 2 to enter the competition area. Once athletes enter the Call Room and until the end of the event they may only leave the Call Room 2 or competition area with permission and accompanied by an official.

### Spikes

Only types of shoes approved by IAAF may be used.

**Dimensions of Spikes:** Spike which projects from the sole or the heel shall not exceed 9 mm except in the high jump and javelin throw events where it shall not exceed 12 mm. These spikes shall have a maximum diameter of 4 mm, at least for the half of its length closest to the tip of the spikes.

**The Sole and the Heel:** The sole and/or heel may have grooves, ridges, indentations or protuberances, provided these features are constructed of the same or similar material to the basic sole itself. In the high jump and long jump, the sole shall have a maximum thickness of 13 mm and the heel in high jump shall have a maximum thickness of 19 mm. In all other events the sole and/or heel may be of any thickness.

**Quantity:** Maximum 11 pieces of spikes are permitted on each sole.

To avoid any delays before the registration the team leaders shall make sure that their athletes fully comply with the above rules.

### Competition Numbers

For Individual Events, each athlete will receive four bib numbers. These must be pinned to the front and back of the competition clothing, to the back of the official tracksuit and to the bag. Exceptions are made for High Jumpers and Pole Vaulters: these athletes are permitted to attach the bib only to the front or to the back of their competition clothing (plus their tracksuit and bag). Bibs must not be cut, folded or covered in any way.

Each runner in a relay team must wear the bib with the official three-letter country code of his/her national federation on his/her front. On his/her back the runner must wear the personal bib.

The participants in Track Events wear on assigned side of their shorts the additional leg numbers which they will receive immediately before the start from the starter assistants. In the relay, leg numbers will be issued only to the last runner in each team. This will be issued by the Umpire at the last take over zone.

For the Combined Events, the leading athlete after each event will be given a special bib (yellow background) indicating he/she is the leading athlete, to be worn on his chest. Athletes competing in the last heat of the 800 m and 1,500 m will also be given a special bib, to be worn on their chests, which will indicate their position in the competition prior to the last event. These bibs will be distributed at Combined Events Rest Area, managed by the Combined Events Referee.





## Competition Preparation

### Field Events

Each participant in throwing events may have two preparation trials, taken in the competition order and strictly supervised by the judges. In the remaining field events, the practice trials will be supervised by the relevant judges.

Only official markers provided by the OC will be allowed for marking the runways. Once the practice jumps/puts/throws for the final are finished, participants will be asked to stand in the order of the competition, for the presentation.

### Track Events:

Tracksuits shall be placed in baskets at the start, and these will be taken to the Kits Collection Area (at the Post Event Control Centre) to be collected after the race. Presentation of the participants in track events will take place just before the start of each race.

For the relays athletes may use only official check mark tape (one per team for each takeover zone) offered by the Umpires at the takeover zones.

### Starter's Commands

The starter's commands will be given in English.

The starter's command for the distances up to and including 400 m and 4 x 400 m relay are:

- "On your marks."
- "Set."
- Fire of the gun.
- For distances of 800 m and over, the commands will be:
- "On your marks."
- Fire of the gun.

Swiss Timing starting blocks will be used at the Athletics Events of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan. These blocks have a false start detection system and are linked to the false start console.

### Timing

The official timing will be provided by Swiss Timing and will be displayed on the official electronic timing instrument and photo finish cameras provided by Swiss Timing. For all races of 800 m or more, the elapsed time will be displayed on electronic timers located at the end of each straight.

### Measurements

All field events will be measured by Swiss Timing Electronic Distance Measurement (EDM) equipment. Measurements in high jumping are made manually.

### Sport Presentation Format

Prior to the finals, athletes will be introduced to the spectators individually in the same order that they will compete.

The winner will also be permitted a lap of honour.

### Leaving the Competition Area

An athlete may only leave the competition area when accompanied by a judge. The intention has to be communicated to the Referee.

After the competition, athletes leave immediately through the mixed zone, located near the finish line. The exit route passes the interview cameras of the TV, then through the radio interview area into the mixed zone. The clothing baskets will be brought to Kits Collection Area at the Post Event Control Centre.

Athletes, competing in field events, who have reached the qualifying standard, may leave the competition area immediately accompanied by a judge.

In the finals of the vertical jumps, athletes who have been eliminated may leave the competition area immediately accompanied by a judge. However, the three best competitors shall leave together.

### Mixed Zone

Athletes are obliged to exit through the MIXED ZONE, situated after the finish line on the right side and clearly marked. For the race walk and the half-marathon the mixed zone will be situated behind the finish gate.

A priority to interview the athletes goes to the official media department of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan and host broadcaster, whose journalists will be easily recognized by their uniforms.

Medallists and their coaching teams are obliged to attend a press conference should there be a request from the organiser. If so, the request will be officially handed in to the Head of the Delegation by a Press Centre representative.

### Post Event Control

Baskets with personal belongings will be delivered to the athletes at the Post Event Control Centre (Kits Collection Area).

Accreditation passes will be returned to athletes at this area.

The items confiscated at Call Room 2 will be returned at this area.

Doping Control Chaperones will complete the notification with any athletes who have been selected for testing and accompany them to the Doping Control Station.

Athletes who have placed on the first, second and third places will be accompanied to the Victory Ceremony.



**Exclusion of Athletes**

As set out in Competition rule 142.4, athletes will be excluded from all further events in the Universiade, including relays, in the following cases:

- If their participation in a final was confirmed, but they failed to take part without giving a valid reason. The reason for not participating must be submitted to the TIC prior to the Call Room deadline for that event.
- If they qualified in the preliminaries but failed to take part in the next round without giving a valid reason. The reason for not participating must be submitted to the TIC prior to the Call Room deadline for that event.

The justification of the reason for not participating in all cases must be approved by the Technical Delegate.

**Sport Equipment and Clothing**

The sport equipment for the Athletics competition of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade will be approved by FISU and needs to be IAAF certified and provided by the Organising Committee.

The implements provided by the OC (Appendix №2) are selected from those appearing on the current IAAF approved equipment list and some of them were the most used implements at the Universiade Shenzhen 2011 and WCH Daegu 2011.

The competition management shall provide all authorized equipment for training and competition.

Personal implements, not in the implements list, but from the IAAF implements list, must be presented at the Implements Office in the Main Stadium (Appendix №7) by 19:00 in the evening before the start of the event, and will be returned at the same place after the final competition of that event.

Athletes will be permitted to use their own personal implements upon approval under the condition:

- They have IAAF certification.
- They are not already on the official list.
- They are in good conditions and the brand is easily recognized.
- They are made available to all the other athletes until the end of the Final.
- They will have to be submitted to the Implements Room (Appendix №7) the day before the event and no later than 19:30.
- Basic implements will be provided for warm up and training.

**Vaulting Poles**

The OC shall be responsible for poles' transportation and storage.

All poles must be labelled with the name and country of the athlete. The poles for

vaulting shall be delivered from the airport/railway station of Kazan to the storage unit at the Universiade Village Stadium. The poles shall be further delivered to the Central Stadium for competition and subsequently brought back to the storage unit. Departing delegations shall receive the poles back from the Universiade Village Stadium storage unit and further transportation will be organised as required.

**Run markers (Cones)**

Athletes are not allowed to use their own markers. The competitors in long jump, pole vault and javelin must use at most two markers provided by the Organising Committee. The competitors in high jumping are provided with adhesive tape. In the relays the competitors may use only one marker as it is envisaged by IAAF rules. Athletes and Technical Officials may not use markers or flowing writers in the running zone.

**Competition Clothing**

All athletes must wear the National federation's official team clothing. Team clothing must be uniform. An athlete wearing any other clothing than the National federation's official team clothing will have no access to the competition area and will not be allowed to compete.

The clothing will be checked in the Call Room 2 before entering the Stadium.

A full set of photographs of the competition clothing (vest, shorts and tights) as well as tracksuits must be provided together with the nominative entries to the Organising Committee (preferably in an electronic version) by Tuesday, June 6, 2013 at the latest:

- JPEG file, maximum resolution and size 300 dpi / 500 KB;
- Compressed ZIP file, if possible;
- The name of file should clearly indicate the name of the country, for example: Russia.jpg.

This rule applies both to competition clothing (vest, shorts and tights) as well as to tracksuits.

The rule stipulating the compulsory wearing of the official competition clothing will be applied during the competition but also during any victory lap, interviews at the Stadium and Victory Ceremonies.

It is mandatory for the colour on athletes' vests to be the same on the front and back. Regarding advertising the organiser refers to the IAAF Rule 8 and 143 and the 2010 IAAF Advertising Rules and Regulations in which detailed instructions regarding competition clothing are given. Compliance with the rules will be controlled in the call room and at the competition sites during the competition.

Athletes may not enter the competition site wearing clothes not complying with the rules of IAAF.

**Authorized equipment**

FISU Technical delegates have authorised the list of the equipment used in track-and-field competitions of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan. Please refer to Appendix №2.



## Doping Control

The use of doping is strictly forbidden according to the Regulations for the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan. All athletes in the Universiade shall abide by relevant anti-doping rules and regulations. Any athlete may be required to undertake a doping control test at any time.

Doping Control will be carried out according to the most recent WADA Rules and Procedures under the supervision of the FISU Medical Committee.

Athletes selected for doping control shall be informed by anti-doping officials. Athletes will be required to sign a confirmation of notification. Athletes who are to be tested may invite a team official to accompany them to the Doping Control Station (DCS).

A selected athlete should report immediately to the DCS unless there are valid reasons for delay (for example Victory Ceremony). All selected athletes will be accompanied by a trained chaperone or Doping Control Officer from the time of notification until arrival at the DCS. Athletes are reminded that refusal to provide a sample can render them liable for an anti-doping violation.

Athletes who are required to use prescribed medication for the treatment of a medical condition should ensure that they have registered their medication, where necessary, through ADAMS prior to attending the Championships or provide a Therapeutic Use Exemption.

The analysis of samples will be done by the WADA-accredited laboratory "Anti-doping Centre" in Moscow. The results of all analyses shall be reported directly to the Chair of the FISU Medical Committee and the IAAF.

Any athlete who tries to avoid or refuses to take a doping control test or who is found guilty of doping shall be disqualified and may be subjected to disciplinary actions.

For the interpretation of Doping Control Regulations, the FISU Medical Committee is the sole authority.

### Additional Controls in Case of National Records

Athletes achieving National Records, who have not been selected for doping control, may present themselves for testing. These athletes must report to the TIC where they will have to complete the "FISU Doping Control Request Form". They will then be escorted to the Doping Control Station.

The cost of such doping test is 300 US dollars or the equivalent sum in Rubles or Euro to be paid in cash. The leader of the delegation shall settle the payment at the TIC prior to conducting the test.

## Protests and Appeals

Protests and Appeals shall be conducted in accordance with Regulations for the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan:

- 11.2** Any protest of a sport nature or disciplinary nature, must reach the jury through the referee or other competent official according to the regulations laid down by the appropriate ISF or by the technical regulations.
- 11.3** Each Head of Delegation or his/her deputy has recourse to protest against the decision of the Jury. This protest must be submitted in writing to the Jury of Appeal in accordance with the regulations of the appropriate ISF. Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit of fifty Euros (50€) which will be returned if the protest is considered to be justified.
- 11.4** Any decision of the Jury of Appeal of a sport event is final and must be reported immediately to the Head of Delegation of the country concerned.

Protests concerning the procedure and the results of the event shall be submitted within 30 minutes after the official event results are displayed in TIC. The protests shall be raised verbally directly to the referee by athlete and by team leader. After the referee has made his decision the athlete shall submit in written form the official protest to the jury of appeal following the FISU regulation article 11.3.

## Awards

### Medals and Diplomas

- A gold medal, a silver medal and a bronze medal will be awarded to the first three (3) athletes in each individual event and the first three (3) teams in each relay race and the half Marathon and Race Walking will be presented with a gold medal, silver medal and bronze medal.
- The first eight athletes will receive a Diploma of Honour.
- Diplomas of participation and of honour are not distributed to winners at the Medal-Awarding ceremony. They are handed to the Head of Delegation or an appointed representative of each delegation in the Athlete's Village at a later time.

### Victory Ceremony

- The first three athletes/ teams in each event must attend the Medal-Awarding Ceremony.
- In case one or two winners are unable to attend, the medals and bouquets are delivered to an official of the relevant delegation. The official must not mount the podium but walk in front of it and take the medal and bouquets in his/her hands.
- In case all the winners cannot be present, the ceremony is postponed. Any decision will be agreed between FISU and the Organising Committee.
- The medal presentation will normally take place before the doping control



procedures and the official press conference. The OC staff will be responsible to gather the first three (3) athletes or teams and escort them to the ceremony waiting area where they will wait for the ceremony.

- Immediately after the half Marathon and Race Walking, a Flower Ceremony will take place near the finish line for the first three individuals.
- When a delegation competes in relay semi-finals and finals with more than four (4) athletes, only the four athletes in the final will be awarded medals in the official ceremony. The other athletes will receive their medals later through the TIC.
- The athletes are not allowed to take any national flags or any other national, cultural or religious symbol on the podium.
- Winners are expected to attend the ceremony in the uniforms they wore at the Opening Ceremony. However, they are allowed to attend the official ceremony wearing sports uniforms when the ceremony takes place immediately after the competition.
- Athletes are expected to take off caps when receiving the medal and keep it in hand throughout the ceremony (i.e. playing of the FISU anthem and raising of the flags).
- Athletes, authorities and accompanying persons are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the FISU anthem is being played.
- Medallists have to remain at disposal of the press after the Medal-Awarding ceremony.
- An official photograph must be taken before the medal winners depart from the zone of the ceremony.
- The official languages for the Victory Ceremonies will be Russian and English.

- information about technical meetings;
- distribution of daily bulletins about the official results from the previous day of competition, and the competition schedule for the current day;
- distribution of Technical Handbooks to team representatives;
- distribution of a CD containing the official results, in full, on the final day of competition.

The Main Sport Information Centre will be operated between 7:00 and 23:00 from June 29 till July 20, 2013.

Sport Information Centres are located in all competition venues and will provide the athletes, Head of Delegations, team representatives, international and national technical officials with sports information and general information (e.g. transport schedule, catering, excursions).

The opening days of the Sport Information Centres will be subject to the competition schedules of different sports following their daily run sheet. They will be operated 2 hours before the competition starts and 1 hour after the departure of the last client group from the venue.

## Press Interview

Venue Media Centres are set up in all competition venues to facilitate interviews and reports by accredited media. After the competitions all athletes must exit the Field of Play through the Mixed Zone. Coaches and winning athletes / teams take part in press conferences on request of the press centre manager 20-30 minutes after the awarding ceremonies. All press conferences will be supported by consistent translation. Interpretations will be made from the language that is spoken by the athlete or coach into English and Russian.

## Sport Information Services

### Main Sport Information Centre of the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013, Kazan

The Main Sport Information Centre located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Main International Centre of the Universiade Village forms and provides the following information to the client sports groups during the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade 2013:

- competition schedule;
- training schedule;
- start lists;
- sports results (final protocols, summarised protocols, statistics);
- medals table;

The Main Sport Information Centre will be operated between 7:00 and 23:00 from June 29 till July 20, 2013.

Sport Information Centres are located in all competition venues and will provide the athletes, Head of Delegations, team representatives, international and national technical officials with sports information and general information (e.g. transport schedule, catering, excursions).

The opening days of the Sport Information Centres will be subject to the competition schedules of different sports following their daily run sheet. They will be operated 2 hours before the competition starts and 1 hour after the departure of the last client group from the venue.
