New I.A.A.F Ranking System

The IAAF are adopting a new system of ranking athletes in all events and allocating places at major championships such as the Olympic Games and IAAF World Athletic Championships.

To summarise each of the four international racewalking events will have its own separate ranking system, based on points allocated in the main event, as well as in similar events - outlined below:

Event Group	Main Event	Similar Events
Men's 20km	20km	10km & 15km
Men's 50km	50km	20km, 30km & 35km
Women's 20km	20km	5km, 10km, 20km & 50km
Women's 50km	50km	20km, 30km & 35km

In order to be ranked, athletes must collect sufficient Performance Scores and some of them must come from Main Events. The minimum number of Performance Scores are as follows:

In Men's and Women's 20km, the minimum number of Performance Scores are three. In Men's and Women's 50km, the minimum number of Performance Scores are two.

For the 2019 IAAF World Championships, places will be allocated, based on the walker's IAAF Ranking, with a maximum of three walkers per country per event. Gone are the A and B qualification standards and someone doing a big one off time in a selection trial to gain a spot in an international team.

Qualification System Published for 2020 Olympics

The IAAF Council, at their meeting in Buenos Aires, have approved the qualification system for the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 and includes details of the entry numbers (*Men's 20km – 60, Women's 20km – 60 & Men's 50km – 60*) for each discipline and the qualification timeline.

For the 10,000m, marathon, race walks, combined events and relays, the qualification period runs from 1 January 2019 to 29 June 2020. For all other events, the qualification period runs from 1 July 2019 to 29 June 2020.

Athletes can qualify in one of two ways:

- By virtue of their IAAF world ranking position at the end of the qualification period.
- Achieving the entry standard within the qualification period.

Entry standards will be approved and published later this year but will be set for the sole purpose of qualifying athletes with exceptional performances unable to qualify through the IAAF world rankings pathway.

International Results

Müller Anniversary Games, London Stadium (Sat. 21st Jul.) The Müller Anniversary Games got off to a record-breaking start on as Tom Bosworth raced to victory in the 3000m walk.

Going through halfway in 5:22, Bosworth was on target to make history and keeping his composure crossed the finish line in a time of 10:43.84. Bosworth was pushed all the way by South Africa's Lebogang Shange who finished a few seconds behind him.

Shange was also inside the previous world record with his time of 10:47.08. Callum Wilkinson was third in 11:13.77.



The previous best time of 10:47.11 for the 3000m walk had stood for 28 years having been set by Italian Giovanni De Benedictis on 19th May 1990 in San Giovanni Valdarno (ITA).

Bosworth said "It was a shock to do that. I've just come back from altitude training, but I still wanted to see what I could do, and this is all heading in the right direction for the Europeans. Coming to the London Stadium changes everything for me. Usually I'm on the road and race walking isn't included in the Diamond League very often.

I thought there was going to be trouble if I got beaten, but I knew the crowd would push me home in that world class field. He (Shange) was fourth in London last year and I knew it was going to take a PB to win. I use the shorter races to prepare for the 20km races."

Midland & British Masters 20km Championships, Warwick University, Coventry (Sun. 15th Jul.)

On the established 1km lap course on the Science Park, Warwick University, nineteen walkers were on the start line for the Midland and BMAF 20km Championships, *reports Glyn Jones*. The weather as predicted was very warm and seemed to increase in temperature as the afternoon wore on. A drinks station and separate sponging station were provided on the course and which were continually and sensibly used by the athletes in view of the conditions. Even so the hot weather did not relent. After leading the field for five laps, Francisco Reis pulled up with a recurring hamstring injury. Some athletes unfortunately as the race progressed suffered disqualifications, thus leaving only seven men and four women to finish the race, some looking very weary.

David Annetts was overall winner of the race by a clear margin and was followed home in overall second place by Lisa Kehler who won the women's Midland Championship. Mark Williams came home in third place to retain his Midland title and was part of the winning team in both the Midland and BMAF Championships.

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Sarnia WC Heritage Group Championship Race Eight 10 Mile Road Walk, Pleinmont to Lancresse (Sun. 15th Jul.)

A hot summers morning greeted the walkers for their 10 miles race along the west coast of Guernsey from Pleinmont to Lancresse, *reports Rob Elliott*. Windless for much of the route and avoiding the temptation of the tempting clear high water just metres away, Donna Allan scored a win for the woman with a lonely race at the front of the field to take the honours in 1:41:29. The conditions ruled out any attempt to get close to the Guernsey women's 10-mile best time as she settled for a new personal best instead, only feeling the effects of the conditions late in the race.

In the absence of Championship leader Stuart Le Noury, it was a race between Rob Elliott and Phil Lockwood to bring the men home. Elliott secured a gap of 75 metres early on and held it virtually throughout the race. A glance in a convenient shop window with a mile to go showed Elliott the gap which he increased in the final mile.
