British Athletics World Class Programme 2020

British Athletics has announced that 68 athletes have been offered membership to the Olympic World Class Programme (WCP) for 2020

Tom Bosworth (Andi Drake; Tonbridge AC), who finished seventh in the 20km race walk at this year's World Championships in Doha, has been recognised for his performance by being moved from Olympic Podium Potential to Olympic Podium level.

Callum Wilkinson (Robert Heffernan; Enfield & Haringey AC) is one of twenty-nine athletes named on the Olympic Podium Potential tier.

2020 Olympic Walks set to be located at Odori Park, Sapporo

The race walks and marathons at next year's Olympic Games, moved from Tokyo to Sapporo, are set to start and finish at Odori Park, Sapporo following a proposal put forward the by the organisers.



Tokyo 2020 met city officials to discuss plans for the events following the International Olympic Committee (IOC) decision to move them 800 kilometres from the Japanese capital to Sapporo because of fears

Organisers are aiming to make a detailed proposal on the arrangements for the race walks and marathon, including the course and other logistical issues, to the IOC Executive Board at its December 3rd to 5th meeting.

A spokesperson for Tokyo 2020 confirmed they had proposed Odori Park, the start and finish point for the annual Hokkaido Marathon, as the main location for the events.

Overseas Results

Australian National 50km Championships and Invitational Races, Fawkner Park, Melbourne (Sun. 1st Dec.)

50km: The early pace was dictated by Perseus Karlstrom (SWE) who led the race up until the 40km but started to struggle with a hip problem and dropped out at 41km. Victory went to Rhydian Cowley (AUS) in a debut time of 3:52:58.

Only one woman started the race – Tracy Feiner who clocked 4:59:32.

20km: Tom Bosworth (GBR) and Kyle Swan (AUS) walked together for the early part of the race before Bosworth surged clear in the second half to take the win. Bosworth said "Best I've felt all year! Strength work and consistent training coming along nicely. Started off as a training walk but a quality field and good conditions meant I felt great and walked 1:22:50 for 20km, not bad for December. Feels like I've finally got things together."

In the women's 20km less than a minute covered the first three.

Enfield Race Walking League

2019 was another year of milestone's for the League; For the first time the rankings were topped by athletes aged under 20; George Wilkinson and Jacqueline Benson, the former being the youngest ever to win the Overall compeition and Jacqueline the youngest lady champion. In addition Jaqueline's club Ashford AC became the seventh club to qualify to have its name on the honours board.

The top six walkers was made up of an equal number of men and women. Helen Middleton finished in the women's top three for the 10th time, whilst Steve Uttley by virtue of a late string of performances finished second man, increasing his total of podium finishes to six, thus equalling the number set by Dave Sharpe prior to 2007.

Stuart Bennett C858 kept a firm grip on the leading Centurion award ahead of David Kates C936 and John Borgars (c1070)..

The promoting Club notched it's twelfth team victory from old rivals llford AC, but Surrey WC who won the League in 2016 and been placed evry year since 2015 dropped out of the first three and were pressed by Belgave Harriers as the season ended.

The number of participants in the League was 108, four down on 2018, but a welcoming trend was the appearance of several newcomers and the coaches who encouraged them to do so should be congratulated, not just for introducing them to race walking, but in most cases sending them to compete with good techniques.

Although named the Enfield League, it only continues to prosper because of input by way of officials and volunteers who hale from other clubs and organisations, so to them a huge thank you!
