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### WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week is 14 year old Gold Coast walker **Jayda Anderson**. She last won my weekly accolade in early June with a super fast 2000m walk of 9:18 as a 13 year old. Now 5 months later, she showed just how much she has improved, with a weekend in which she knocked out 3 very fast walks.

First to Saturday when she won the annual UQ 1500m Track Classic at the University of Queensland Track in St Lucia, Brisbane, with a PB time of **6:26.17**. Then on Sunday, she competed in two walk events at the Little Athletics Queensland Summer Carnival in Brisbane, recording a PB 3000m time of **13:56.91** and backing up with a 15000m time of **6:52.60**.

Now that is an impressive weekend for a 14 year old walker! Well done Jayda.

### WHAT'S COMING UP

- AV Shield returns with Round 4 on **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> November** at venues around Victoria. Round 4 is the Relay Round, with **4x800m walk relays** (2 males and 2 females per team apparently) at each of the 5 venues (Knox, Doncaster, Geelong, Ballarat and Bendigo). I will be in the Coburg Harriers 4x800m walk team at Doncaster. Hopefully clubs can get enough teams together to make this an exciting event. So come on everyone and get those teams organised! A bit more info about the mixed 4x800m walks relays that are to be held as part of AVSL Round 4. Club relay teams must have 2 male and 2 female walkers to score points. The idea here is to encourage clubs to foster greater engagement between both genders and to reward clubs that champion gender equity through their membership base. Teams may order walkers in whatever order suits them. Hopefully that will led to exciting races, with teams swapping positions as different speed

walkers hit the track. Walkers will not be required to carry a baton - a simple touch of hands at the changeover will be sufficient. AV will position the Track Referee at the finish line, along with a track official, to assist with the change-over, so the walks judges will not need to worry about this aspect of the race. Based on the number of walkers racing each week, we are hopeful of at least 8 walk teams at each of the metro venues. Note that if clubs can't put together a mixed team of 2 male and 2 female walkers, they can still enter a team (eg with 4 male walkers), but they will not score points. But it means that they can at least participate in what will be an exciting new event. **So get busy and start organising your team.**

Here's a bit of a blurb on each of the walkers

- **Corey Dickson** dominated the Victorian junior ranks this winter, with two AV titles, gold and silver at the LBG Carnival in Canberra, a further silver at the National Roadwalk champs in Adelaide, a bronze in the Oceania Championships (U18) in Townsville and some significant PBs. In addition, he never finished lower than 2nd in any of the VRWC open races in which he completed. Corey's determination to develop his condition and racing fitness have set him up as one of the most promising young walkers in the country.
- This winter saw **Tracy Feiner's** most consistent racing for many years. Specialising in the longer distances, her returns included an AV title (30km with a huge PB) and a silver in the AV 15km, another silver in the National 20km and an impressive Ray Smith trophy win (VRWC 35km). Tracey exhibits a model technique for long racing and an exemplary level of fitness that, we hope, will carry her all the way on her second attempt at 50km in December.
- This winter season has shown a very determined **Kyle Swan** returning to top form, with impressive times in all distances, setting PBs of 15km 1:07:48, 20km 1:31:42 and 30km 2:37:29. He won the Open 15km walk at the LBG Carnival in Canberra and took silver in the Australian 20km Roadwalk Championship in Adelaide and took silvers in the Victorian 10km, 15km, 20km and 30km Championships. He also won the VRWC winter season Open Category Actual Times, Handicap and Style Award competitions.

- **Alanna Peart** continued her winning ways this winter with a string of top performances. She won the Victorian Country Championships U18 5km roadwalk in 24:00, won double golds in the LBG Carnival in Canberra (Open 5km and U16 3km), won the Vic U18 5km Roadwalk Champ in a PB 23:12 and won further gold in the Australian Roadwalk Championships (U18 5km). Arguably our top Australian female junior walker at the moment.

Note that our elite walkers, who receive financial support from AA, are excluded from the list of nominees as these athletes already have a good level of support. This sponsorship is aimed at walkers who are currently self funded. That means that our two top walkers, Rhydian Cowley and Jemima Montag, were not eligible. That opened the door for Kyle and Tracy to take our Open awards, and they are worthy winners indeed. Add to that our junior winners in Corey and Alanna and you have 4 darn good walkers.

The Open winners will each receive \$500 in cash, along with a \$500 gift voucher for Neil Ryan's Runners World shop in Kew. The Junior winners will each receive a \$500 gift voucher for Neil Ryan's Runners World shop in Kew. Neil will be on hand at our VRWC Summer Season Championship races at Middle Park on the morning of Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> November to make the presentations.

- A decision on whether a suspension should be reimposed on Russia could be made by the end of next month, WADA revealed last week, but the reinstatement case may have been damaged by new reports from Microsoft claiming a group linked to the Moscow Government tried to hack the computers of 16 international anti-doping agencies. In a blog post written by Tom Burt, the corporate vice-president of customer security and trust at Microsoft, it is claimed the hackers began their attacks on September 16. That was shortly before reports emerged that WADA suspected Russia had tampered with evidence they had handed over the Moscow Laboratory. - At the same time, RUSADA confirmed that there had been no attempts to hack their own systems. This will raise suspicions that cyber espionage groups with links to Vladimir Putin's Government were behind a campaign to get information from the 16 international anti-doping agencies. - Australia's anti-doping chief has become the first international doping figure to heap pressure on WADA to ban Russian athletes competing at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) chief executive David Sharpe on Wednesday made the extraordinary declaration following WADA's announcement last month that Russia had three weeks to explain how multiple drug tests were deleted from a database of records Russia sent to WADA as part of the global anti-doping body's investigation into allegations of state-backed, systematic doping. - This follows on from Sharpe's announcement that last year ASADA had repelled cyber attacks from state-sponsored Russian hacking group Fancy Bear, predicting the threat of further online assaults to rise if Russia is banned from next year's Olympic Games in Tokyo. The revelation comes two days after software giant Microsoft said its threat intelligence centre found at least 16 national anti-doping agencies and sporting bodies had been targeted by the hackers in September in attacks that began shortly before WADA announced doping compliance proceedings against Russia over "inconsistencies" in historical lab test data provided to WADA from Moscow. - Athletes such as footballers who test positive to cocaine or other social drugs on match day will no longer be banned for years and could serve as little as one month if changes to the World Anti-Doping Agency code are approved next week. At last common sense prevails. I have been against this draconian provision for years now. - Former British Cycling and Team Sky doctor Richard Freeman will admit to a medical tribunal he "told a lot of lies" and that he ordered the banned substance testosterone. He will claim the 30 Testogel sachets were not for an athlete but were ordered on behalf of ex-British Cycling and Team Sky coach Shane Sutton. What can you say except that it sounds like more lies to me. It is my view that the testosterone was for Sky riders. See <https://www.bbc.com/sport/cycling/50219337>.
- Yuliya Gushchina (sprinter), Anna Nazarova/Klyashtornaya (long jump) and Olesya Sviridova (shotput) have been sanctioned for anti-doping rule violations (turinabol, and stanozolol) as a result of retrospective testing.
