

#### **Cancellation of Lugano Trophy**

Message received from the organisers of the Lugano Trophy, which was one of England Athletics international opportunities for Race Walkers.

We are sorry to announce that the 17<sup>th</sup> edition of the Lugano Trophy – Memorial Mario Albisetti, scheduled in Lugano on Sunday, March 8, 2020, is cancelled for public health reasons. The deteriorating situation of the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in Switzerland led the Federal Council yesterday to take the first steps to combat coronavirus infection.

These include a ban on events on the whole Swiss territory with more than 1'000 people present at the same time, while at the same time inviting the relevant cantonal authorities to assess the risk situation for public or private events with lower turnout. For this reason, we immediately contacted the cantonal doctor's office, presenting to him our assessment of the risks related to the organization of the Lugano Trophy competition and we received negative notice at the event.

The measures subsequently adopted by the Ticino State Council last night for the organization of events with a turnout of less than 1'000 people but with international participation, confirm the approach adopted and the conclusions to which the relevant cantonal authority has reached.

Given the international calendar of racewalking competitions, the Organizing Committee does not plan to re-schedule the event on another date in 2020.

#### **National Results**

#### SPAR British Athletics Indoor Championships, Emirates Arena, Glasgow (Sun. 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb.)

Tom Bosworth lowered his own British Indoor 5000m race walk record clocking 18:20.97. He removed nearly eight seconds from his previous mark of 18:28.70 claiming his sixth consecutive indoor title. He pulled away immediately from the gun and recorded 1000m splits of 3:44.03, 3:40.54 (7:24.57), 3:40.00 (11:04.57), 3:42.01 (14:46.58) and 3:34.97. Behind Bosworth, Tom Partington and Luc Legon both recorded personal bests as they picked up silver and bronze respectively.

In the women's race gold went to Abigail Jennings who also set a personal best, with 25:28.46.

# England Athletics Senior Championships, incorporating Molly Barnett Open Walks, Coventry (Sun. 1st Mar.)

Tom Bosworth continued his perfect start to 2020 by setting his second British race walk record in a week when taking the England Athletics title at Coventry over 10km, *reports Dr Ian Richards*.

Fresh from his record-breaking exploits over 5000m in Glasgow at the British Indoor Championships, Bosworth clocked 39:10 for the 10km event to reclaim the record he lost to Callum Wilkinson last year.

"Last week's race indoors took a lot out of my legs, so I am really happy to back this up with another British record over 10km," said Bosworth. I am looking forward to seeing what I can do over 20km next month."

Cameron Corbishley set a personal best of 40:59 in second, while Tom Partington took third place in 44:43.

In the women's race, the open 10km was won by Heather Lewis in a personal best of 45:14 which moves her to fourth on the UK all-time list

Behind her, Gemma Bridge was making a welcome return to racing and took the England title in 48:05.

The England silver went to Abigail Jennings in a personal best 52:26 with Natalie Myers taking the bronze in 55:38.



#### Sam Shoebottom Trophy 10km, Simister (Sat. 8th Feb.)

The first Lancashire WC event of the year was a tremendous boost to our hopes of starting the year on a high point, *reports Dave Evans*. Not only did we see our President in Exile, Tony Taylor, but our great supporters and friends from the Midlands and Yorkshire, Eric Horwill, Glyn Jones and Martin Fisher.

The weather was cool but not too windy despite the impending storm coming from the Atlantic. thirteen aspirants toed the starting line to race the 10k and three walked the shorter 5km distance. Tony Taylor, one of three of the same title, led the field to the park turnaround marshalled by Glyn Jones and as the faster walkers arrived at the 5km point the watch was barely over 27 minutes as Tony T recorded a swift 27:10 followed by Adrian Edwards in 29:46, Martin Fisher 29:48 and Tony Malone 29:51. Tony Bell and new club member Martin Payne passed through in a good 32:36 & 33:00 respectively with the remaining seven 10km exponents not too far in arrears. The 5km performers were in the mix at halfway with Greg Smith posting a relaxed 35:18 followed by Pat Evans in 35:20 and Irene Pike 40:02. Irene has spent more than 12 months recovering from a foot problem which although not totally cured has healed enough to allow her to heel and toe again.

Tony Taylor continued to extend his lead on the final stage of the race and recorded a tremendous time of 54:42. He was well clear of Adrian (59:44), Martin (60:05) and Tony Malone (60:15). Despite the potentially inclement weather everyone walked well, and the handicapper has some material to work with for the next event to be held at Chorley on March 7<sup>th</sup>.

Andrea Lennon won the handicap by four seconds and has waited 17 years to repeat her earlier win. Amongst the spectators was former GB International Chris Harvey who was one of Tony Taylor's adversaries in the 1970's. Chris holds the fastest ever 20k time by a Lancashire WC member, clocking an excellent 1:28:26 over 30 years ago at the 1979 World Cup in Eschborn. Tony is planning to do an interview with Chris about his career soon.

# Manx Harriers Murray Lambden Open Meeting, N.S.C. Douglas, Isle of Man (Sat. 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb.)

#### (Incorporating the Nihill Shield Match & Northern 20km Championships)

The Nihill Shield competition is an England Race Walking Association team versus Ireland U18s. Eleven young English athletes had the opportunity to experience international competition thanks to the support of the RWA and others, *reports Verity Snook*. The English U15 team had five walkers, three girls and two boys and the U17 team one male and five ladies. Team support was provided by Mike Fox, Elizabeth Corran and Verity Snook, thanks to the Manx Harriers for a brilliantly organised event.

First up was the Under 15 3km, who were subjected to high winds and overcast racing conditions, Natasha Mitchell (Winchester), Eddy Purser (City of Portsmouth) and Aisling Lane (Mullingar Harriers – Ireland) set the early pace. These three walked together for the first 1km, with Ellis Simmonds (Derbyshire and South Yorkshire) on a lonely battle against the elements followed by Lola-Mae Billingham (Aldershot, Farnham and District) and Carla Forsythe (Blackheath and Bromley) walking side by side ahead of the two Irish walkers, Abbie Murphy (Celbridge) and Saoirse Kennedy (Celbridge).

Aisling and Eddy pulled away from chasing Natasha, with Eddy stamping his authority on the final lap, finishing very strongly in a massive 2-minute personal best with a credible 15:26. Chasing down Eddy was Aisling Lane (Ireland) 1st female, closely followed in 2nd place Natasha also finishing in another hugely improved personal best in 16:14. Ellis in a lonely race, worked very hard with a solid technique, finished 2nd male in another personal best performance with 17:10. Carla and Lola continued to battle with each other right up to the finish line, crossing together both with personal best times of 18:22 however, the 3rd female position was awarded to Lola and

Carla  $4^{th}$ . Abbie finished  $5^{th}$  and Saoirse  $6^{th}$ , both girls competing for the first time over 3km.

Next up to race was the Under 17 men's and women's race over 5km, the weather conditions having deteriorated further. The gusts of wind reported to be approaching 40mph at times.

The fields were larger, providing a good competition with seven Irish walkers, England six, and a couple of Isle of Man open entries, provided an excellent competitive race for this age group. Early into the lead, as expected, was a foursome of men, was Jake O'Brien (Moy Valley), Christian Hopper (Cambridge Harriers), Andrew Glennon (Mullingar Harriers) and Sam O'Sullivan (Clonmel).

Chasing were Mia Dunwell (Northern IOM AC) and debutant at 5km Abby Hughes (Taunton Athletics Club). The next chasing duo of Leah Murphy (Celbridge) and Lois Carty (Aldershot, Farnham and District) battled hard together, closely followed by Katie Stringer (Medway and Maidstone) in middle ground between chasing packs with Abigail Smith (Blackheath and Bromley) in a group of four, which included open walker Keira Heavy (U20 - Northern IOM AC).

Places changed, with a convincing lead from Jake 1<sup>st</sup>, and a good strong finish in 2<sup>nd</sup> place for Christian with another personal best of 25:23. Both Abby and Mia battled hard up to the final lap, when Abby pipped Mia in the final stages both finishing with personal best times of 25:53 and Mia a massive improvement with 25:54. Irish duo, Ava Ross (Glaslough Harriers) and Leah finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively, pulled away from Lois, leaving her racing alone to finish 5<sup>th</sup> in a season best of 28:12. Mid race Katie struggled but rallied finishing strongly in only her second 5km finishing 6<sup>th</sup> with 28:33, Irish Grainne O'Connor (Clonmel) 7<sup>th</sup>, just ahead of Abigail in 8<sup>th</sup> in huge personal best with 28:48 and open walker Keira 9<sup>th</sup> with a personal best of 29 mins exactly and Ciara Mooney (Adamstown) 10<sup>th</sup>.

The Nihill shield saw exciting competition by all the race walkers, some excellent results where the English RWA team retained the title for 2020.
