WALKER OF THE WEEK



There were many wonderful walking performances at the national All Schools T&F championships at the weekend, any of which would have been worthy of WOTW consideration. Standing tallest, however, were **Sam Lindsay (TAS)** and **Sebastian Richards (SA)**, whose efforts in the U18 5000m championship earned both a qualifier for the World U20 T&F championships in Eugene, Oregon (USA) next August.

Sam, with two sub-21:00s to his credit already, could hardly have believed his luck when the Melbourne weather gods handed him the gift of a dramatic cool change after the gruelling heat the U14s had endured. Suddenly, a record was within reach and he grasped it, consigning Declan Tingay's championship mark to history with a time of **20:07.71**. With the Australian U20 5000m titles scheduled to be on the Supernova program in Canberra on January 25/26, Sam won't have to wait long for his chance to join the 19:00+ brigade!

Sebastian's progress in recent months has been remarkable. With a modest, though respectable, track PB of 22:39, set in April, he gave little indication during winter of what was coming apart from a 21:47 road PB in Ballarat. He

has obviously committed to hard training and he served notice in October with a 12:29 for 3000m in ASA interclub. Like Sam, he seized the favourable racing conditions at Lakeside, posting a 1:03 PB time of **20:44.91** – an outstanding improvement that earned him his own WA qualifier.

*Honourable mentions

- Ela Uzun (VIC) completely dominant in the U17 5000m championship, posting a Meet record time of 22:55.80.
- Max Davidson (VIC) a class above everyone except Lindsay and Richards (who are a year older), winning the boys' U17 title with 21:56.83, a 55 sec PB.
- Callum Martin (NSW) continues to be the yardstick in the mid-teens cohort across the country, also setting a new Meet record for the U15 3000m of 12:21.14.
- Angus Shuttleworth (VIC) recorded his first sub-13:00 time for 3000m with 12:52.51, followed by 49:40 in his debut 10km the next morning.
- **Koby Irvine (QLD)** silver with a PB in the U16 3000m, backed up with a huge 2:45 improvement over 10km the following morning with **49:51**.
- Olivia Boulton (QLD) and Chelsey Ireland (WA) clocked the hardest-earned PBs of the meet, slogging through debilitating early heat in the 5000m before beating their best times by 0:13 and 0:11 respectively.
- Ashleigh Mansell and Lincoln Moore (NSW) emphatic winners in the cauldron of the U14 races, recording virtually
 the same times!
- Jade Chitty (VIC) came to Middle Park on Sunday ready to rock, posting a 1:04 PB for 10km with 54:07.
- John Ronan (WA) mounted a solo time trial to clock 19:53.81 for 5000m in Aths West interclub.

VRWC Club Summer race results, 7 December – Middle Park

There had been some concern that our second summer race fixture, which had already needed to be put back from October owing to a clash with the Melbourne Marathon, would now be impacted by the AA All Schools titles being held on the same December weekend. Not the case as it turned out, with a good lineup of 30 entrants bolstered by four Queensland visitors – **Phoebe Chadwick, Noah Cooke, Eliza Kelly** and **Koby Irvine**, along with **Eva Parker** (TAS) – whose welcome attendance added interest and colour to the races. Notably, Noah, Koby, Eva and **Angus Shuttleworth** had all clocked PBs in hard 3000m Schools races the evening before and were backing up for a 10km road race (as in 'race', not recovery walk.) Now that is commitment!

The proceedings opened with the 20km and 15km races, and it was good seeing several of our elite walkers enjoying a 20k training session together ... apart from **Rhydian Cowley** who preferred a 15km time trial that would have given him a 20k in around 83+ minutes. (I'm not sure that Rhyd actually gets the concept of 'down time' ...)

The 10km was the most productive race, with two PBs and two first-timers posting great results. **Angus** debuted over the distance with a sub-50:00 to go with his first sub-13:00 the day before, while **Koby** made good use of the Victorian's company and flew back to Bundaberg with two PBs for the weekend. **Jade Chitty** negative-split on the way to a 1:04 PB and looked strong throughout, while **Eliza's 57:51** was an excellent first-up result and there should be some good 10k racing between her and Phoebe Chadwick in the future. It was a tough grind for **Eva** who nevertheless managed to add another valuable 10km experience to her resume.



AROUND THE COUNTRY



AA All Schools T&F Championships, 4-7 December – Lakeside Stadium, Melbourne

Two World U20 championship qualifiers, four Meet records and 24 personal best times headed the fine harvest reaped by the 61 walkers who contested the national Schools titles at the weekend. Not surprisingly, the lion's share of this speed bounty was claimed by those lucky enough to enjoy the cool conditions of Saturday evening, in comparison to Thursday's 30C oven which saw the U14s and the U17/18 5000m girls return times over a minute slower than their bests in some cases. By Saturday it was genuinely chilly and ideal for fast walking times.

*U17/U18 5000m

A wind-driven temperature drop provided the girls with some relief in the latter laps of their contest, though by then the damage was done as far as times were concerned. In such circumstances it's resilience and conditioning that prove the telling factors, and so it proved.

The taxing heat made little if any difference to **Ela Uzun**, whose **22:55.80** sundered the 19-year old championship record by a full minute. **Olivia Boulton** latched onto team-mate **Milly Sharpe** for the U17 silver and one of the only two girls' PBs, while Sharpe notched up a win over regular rival **Angelina Legrand** to take the U18 title.

The boys were able to race their full 5000m in much cooler conditions, a tonic to **Sam Lindsay** whose U18 record time of **20:07.71** (eclipsing that of Declan Tingay) must surely secure him a place on the start line in Eugene come August. Joining him should be **Sebastian Richards**, who destroyed his PB by over a minute to clock **20:44.91** in what has to be the result of his life to date. The U17 race saw **Max Davidson** add another national title to his resume, this time with a huge PB of his own, with **Liam Freundt** walking strongly to take the silver over **Christopher Nilon**, another improver.

These youngsters did it tough, in the hottest part of the day, as shown by the fact that the 15 finishers produced only 2 PBs and nobody else was close. If they gained nothing else it was valuable experience in how to produce the best they had in adverse conditions

Ashleigh Mansell and Lincoln Moore earned their titles, both leading throughout and clocking almost identical times. Isabella Welch stayed on Mansell's shoulder in the early laps and dropped away only gradually, while Makenzie Sillito walked an attacking race for bronze. These three girls proved a class above their opposition on the day.

There was no such challenge to the leader in the boys' race, with Moore a clear standout. **Tate McQueen** walked a smart race, taking stock of the situation early before slowly forging into 2nd and hanging on against a fast finish from **Alex Dennett.** That **Sebastian Ryan** was able to improve by 22 secs is an example of how the big occasion can fire you up, whatever the conditions may be.

With a cool, almost cold evening and each other's attacking approach to spur them on, the scene was set for **Mya McClure** (U15) and **Matilda Read** (U16) to produce something special in the combined girls' race. McClure, who'd been knocking on that 13:00 door for so long she had sore knuckles, kicked it down instead with a 25 sec PB for a new championship record of **13:43.13**, while **MiaRose Everson** added yet another silver medal to the NSW haul. Local fans were delighted with **Havana Ali's** bronze, her first podium on the big stage of a national championship.

Read, for her part, shadowed McClure like a wasp, responding to her surges and reeling her back in with a steely resolve, to take the U16 title in 13:45.44, a 13 sec PB. Up-and-coming **Bethany Moore-Kirkland** kept the two Victorians in her sights throughout to clock the equal-biggest PB of the night with 14:09.80. ACT's **Jillian Ryan**, in her second race of the meet following her tough 5000m on Thursday, prevailed over improving **Eva Parker** for the bronze.

Callum Martin followed his usual strategy of an explosive start to build a daunting lead quickly, leaving Angus Shuttleworth (U15) and Noah Cooke (U16) with a mountain to climb. Martin's 12:21.14 wiped out Kodi Clarkson's championship record by 1:03, and we wait eagerly for his arrival in the late teen ranks. Shuttleworth's 12:52.51 cut his previous best by 18 secs, while Cooke equalled his own with the third sub-13:00 of the day to win the U16 title.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

World Athletics has published the schedule for the World Race Walking Team Championships in Brasilia 2026.

(Reprinted from *O Marchador* blogspot – 4 December)

At the World Athletics Executive Council meetings held on the 2nd and 3rd of this month in Monaco, chaired by its president, Sebastian Coe, among other matters discussed, it was decided to approve the competitive program for the World Race Walking Team Championships, to be held in Brasília on April 12, 2026.

Thus, the first starting shot will take place at 7:00 am on Sunday (local time) with the Marathon Race Walking event (men's and women's), and while this event continues, the athletes in the Under-20 category will take to the track, the men at 7:30 am and the women at 8:30 am, both competing in the 10 km distance. At 11:05 am the men will start the Half Marathon Race Walking event and at 12:50 pm it will be the women's turn to compete in the same distance.

Note that the Brazilian calendar for this sport has established that the Loterias Caixa Brazil Race Walking Cup will be held at the Esplanada dos Ministérios in Brasília, an event that will take place on January 25th and will be included in the World Athletics World Tour, in the Bronze category, constituting a test event for the World Team Race Walking Championships and where athletes will have the opportunity to experience it.

In November, World Athletics, represented by Pierce O'Callaghan of WA Competitions, and Alessia Peleson and Thomas Chatin of WA Events, conducted a technical visit that also included the presence and interaction of, among others, Wlamir Motta Campos, president of the CBAt (Brazilian Athletics Confederation), and Helio Gesta de Melo, president of the South American Federation, learning about the logistical and technical aspects of what will be a memorable event, taking place for the first time in South America since its creation in 1961.

C: Good. That means you care. Nothing worth having comes without pain. Now breathe. You've survived every hard day so far. Don't quit before the breakthrough.
