WALKER OF THE WEEK

NSW walkers seem to be attacking WOTW from all points of the globe lately: from Germany (Lizzy McMillen), Sydney (Avia Luketic and Nate Appleyard) and now from the VRWC's own backyard! **Dylan Richardson (NSW)** takes the award this week following a fine fromthe-front display in which he took line honours in the **AV 15km Road championship** with a time of **1:03:42**, smashing his PB by 1:22 in the process.

Dylan, one of the country's most dedicated walkers, rarely misses an opportunity to venture south of the Murray to race at Middle Park on our State championship days, and on Saturday it was his turn to shine. He made the most of it, winning clearly by 38 secs over Collingwood's emerging star Marcus Wakim.

In 2019, as an U20 member of Frank Overton's Central Coast squad, Dylan drew attention with an excellent debut over the then-very-much-alive 50km distance in the National title event at Fawkner Park, clocking 4:22:44. It seemed that the 50 would be his key event in senior ranks. However, as fate (and the IOC/IAAF/World Athletics bloc) would have it, Dylan was one of many budding 50km walkers to see 'their' distance kicked from beneath them, forcing him to remodel himself as a 20-35km man in a field already jam-packed with speedier specialists.

Dylan accepted the challenge. Building up his competitive resources with hard races in

Asia, Europe and at home, he steadily honed his speed to the point where, in 2023, he set three big PBs over 20km, 30km and 35km. He's encountered some tough times since, but his performance in the AV 15km might be a sign that he's back on track and that further success amongst the upper echelon lies ahead.

Well done, Dylan. Your walk on Saturday was great to watch ... not least for the younger ones!

*Honourable mentions:

- Noah Cooke (QLD) a PB performance over 5km to bring him to the edge of sub-23:00 with the AA Junior championships looming.
- Arthur Robinson (VIC) a huge improvement by 1:33 over 5km, showing his focus on this distance is paying off.
- Marcus Wakim (VIC) took the AV 15km title with a new PB after keeping up a relentless chase of Dylan Richardson throughout the race.
- Summer Patten (VIC, 9yo) rewarded for her consistent racing with an enormous 1:20 PB over 2km.
- Nellie Langford (SA) a substantial improvement over 10km by nearly a minute to clock 47:52, her best result for some time
- Sebastian Richards (SA) a 22 see PB in clocking 22:17 for 5km. A sub-22:00 in Ballarat isn't off the radar.

VRWC AV 15km & VRWC championships, 9 August – Middle Park







Another sunny winter afternoon was enjoyed by the 40 walkers, officials and supporters on the final championships day for the season. The marquee races were the AV 15km Road walk championship, along with the VRWC 10km Alf Robinson and Mabel Robinson trophies, with age-group Club championships being hotly contested.

Marcus Wakim (Collingwood) took the Men's AV title with a PB clocking of 1:04:20, a mere 38 secs adrift of overall race winner Dylan Richardson (NSW). Dylan's Mingara clubmate Jack McGinniskin was up with the first two early before falling back and walking his own race for 3rd in 1:10:22.

Jai Wen Heng (Mentone), racing in her third State championship race for the year, found it was third time lucky after a solid performance to hold off Carolyn Rosenbrock (Yarra Ranges) and take her first AV title with 1:32:25. Carolyn produced her usual consistent effort, clocking 1:33:38 for silver.

Marcus's and **Carolyn's** intermediate 10km times were the basis for their wins in the Alf and Mabel Robinson trophy competitions.

The Club Masters 5km championships saw clear wins to **Mark Blackwood** and **Donna-Marie Elms**, while the keenest battle was staged by **John Nottle** who held off **Gerard Feain** by 10 secs after an arm wrestle throughout the race.

Maddie Nash was dominant in the U20 5km Club title, her 25:27 showing her steady return to form is on track. Arthur Robinson was the only male 5km starter, making good use of the conditions to swipe 1:33 from his previous best. Under normal circumstances, the U16 3km would have seen an engrossing battle between Mya McClure and Matilda Read, but both girls can be pleased with their results as Matilda is making progress in her post-illness return, while Mya finished a mere 0:13 outside her PB time.

The seldom-raced 2.5km distance gives young walkers a chance to step up from their usual 1km and 2km distances (raced earlier in the season as Club championships) and test their endurance. Not surprisingly, all bar one of the starters were tackling the 2.5 for the first time. A common inquiry at the timekeepers' table afterwards might have been 'What was my time at 2k?'

Angus Shuttleworth, himself a 2.5 debutant, produced the fastest result with a quick 12:10, while Harrison Ryan's 14:39 might have seen him get close to a sub-17:00 3km. Meanwhile, Pippa Read – her own illness woes behind her – is certainly making up for lost time, ripping 0:39 from her PB to post a winning U12 time of 14:06. We rarely see Ella Harris at Middle Park these days, but her win in the U14 in 14:43 shows she's maintained her fitness and we hope to see more of her. This race provided a tight contest overall, with only 7 seconds separating Kobe Lewis and Caitlyn Shipham for silver and bronze. And a pat on the back to Felix Skurka, tackling a distance well beyond his previous experience and toughing it out with good technique to take the U12 title.













All except one starter in the U10 2km championship either clocked a big PB or their first result at the distance – so hats off to you all! The gloves were off for **Lily Bowkett** and **Dimitri Pashutin** with only 2 secs separating them at the end, while **Bowie Clarke** proved himself the 'comeback kid' from last week with a 50 sec PB. That's the kind of bounce back we like to see in a walker!

The best U10 result of the day came from **Summer Patten**, who demolished her 2km PB by 1:20 for 3rd place, while **Cory Lewis** thought it the right moment to post a PB of her own. 2km was twice the distance **Ava Pravednikov** and **Daisy Hooper** had ever raced, and both girls showed themselves more than equal to the challenge. The tidal wave of improvement from our younger brigade continues unabated.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

UNITED KINGDOM: UK Athletics Championships, 3 August - Birmingham

Cameron Corbishley and Hannah Hopper were the winners of the 5,000m walk events at the UK Athletics Championships held on weekend 2 and 3/8 at the Alexander Stadium track in Birmingham, the venue that will host the European Championships in 2026.

With the races starting within a minute, the men were the first to get into action. Corbishley, of Medway & Maidstone AC, quickly pulled away from his opponents (1,000m in 3:54.79 and 3,000m in 11:48.26) to finish strong and claim his first championship title in 19:51.83, close to his personal best (19:40.10 in Cardiff 2024). He was joined on the podium by Christopher Snook, of Aldershot Farnham & District, with 21:38.67, and Luc Legon, of Bexley AC, with 23:19.99.

In the women's event, 22-year-old **Hannah Hopper** added a new personal best time of **24:24.42** to her overall title, beating her previous best time (24:46.43 in Manchester-2023) by 22 seconds. Second place went to **Bethan Davies**, Cardiff AC, who recently returned to the sport after maternity leave, achieving **24:47.93**, the championship record holder with 21:21.52 in 2017. In third place was **Abigail Jennings**, with **24:54.66**, her best time of the season. (*Report courtesy of O Marchador*)

- An event group expert, for example a performance support provider (e.g. therapist, scientist etc) that has supported a specific Event Group athlete/coach's senior Championship preparation.

A family race entry rate is available to any family of 3 or more financial members.

Non-members may pay a reduced financial member rate for the first race they attend but pay the higher non financial

rate for subsequent races. Season's ticket: all VRWC races, not Little Athletics, AV, VMA or RWA.

** VRWC ANNUAL FEES

These are reviewed at the Annual General Meeting each year. Below are the current fees as of 1st April 2025:

Senior (Open and Masters) \$30.00 Under 20: \$25.00 Under 16: \$15.00 Associate (Officials who assist with races throughout the year): \$ 0.00 Family membership: \$50.00

Annual Subscriptions are due on **April 1**st of each calendar year. Inner metro and outside ring metro members pay full fees.

Country members, pay 50% of the annual fee.

(The outside ring of metropolitan councils are: Wyndham, Melton, Hume, Whittlesea, Nillumbik, Yarra Ranges, Cardinia, Casey, and the Mornington peninsula down to Mornington. Outside of these areas are considered country area.)

*UNIFORMS - Remember also that all competing members are required to wear the current Club racing uniform (singlet, racing top or crop top), in order to be eligible for Time or Handicap points and to race in Club championships. The cost of each item is \$45. (Families: \$45 for the first child, \$35 for siblings.)

DOGS OFF LEASH

It is a Parks Victoria regulation that dogs must be on leash in all areas of the Albert Park/Middle Park public use precinct, except for designated off-leash zones.

VRWC members, supporters and parents who notice dogs off leash near our race courses or official/assembly areas should notify myself, Mark Donahoo or Terry Swan.
