VRWC Club points races, 11 May – Middle Park

While a certain amount of GP fencing and equipment has been moved out, the northern leg of the course is not yet fit for public use and nobody seems to be busting a gut to make it so. Therefore, it was back onto our southern 1km loop for another week. Fortunately, we couldn't have had better weather for our races, and an encouraging entry of 42 walkers lined up to take advantage of the mild, sunny conditions, and the twisty course didn't prevent the posting of seven PBs. It was also pleasing to see a large number of walkers attempting unfamiliar distances, clocking those all-important base times for future handicap results.

Emilie Garside was the biggest improver of the day, ripping a huge 2:25 from her 4km PB and showing the benefit of a summer of AVSL racing. The other PB's came predominantly from the younger camp, with **Abby Fowler** displaying her natural finishing speed to good effect in the 1km and newcomer **Aria Di Benedetto** cutting her own time by a similar amount.

Marcus Wakim chose the 6km for his first outing since his Team bronze-winning effort in Turkiye, racing in company with Mark Blackwood before pulling away for a leisurely 28:29. Meanwhile, Mya McClure, fresh from her own success at the Australian Little Athletics titles (see report below), tackled the 4km for the first time with confidence to take fastest time with 21:14.

It was great to see **Andrew Jamieson** and **Kevin Cassidy** back in harness after some time away. We all know it doesn't get easier at the years tick past, but time alone will never defeat these two warriors! **Gwen Steed** and **Terry O'Neill** had good handicap wins in competitive age groups.




Annual Subscriptions are due on April 1st of each calendar year. Inner metro and outside ring metro members pay full fees.

** WALKER OF THE WEEK **

In the last issue, it was dual Olympians Jemima Montag and Rhydian Cowley who took out the WOTW award. For this week's gong, we revisit the place where it all began for them ... Little Athletics. And no, Rhyd and Jemima didn't jump into a time capsule. Today, the focus is on two of our most exciting prospects – **Max Davidson** and **Mya McClure (VIC)** – winners of 1500m titles at the recent Australian Little Athletics T&F championships in Adelaide by big margins and with big PBs.

Max, who has shown great potential for a number of years yet only really surfaced at summer championship time, took a big step up during 2023-24's AVSL season and showed the benefit of a full summer of racing over 2000m and 3000m. Winning the U15 title in 6:19.63 – a time that shattered his previous best by 21 secs – Max has found the incentive to pursue race walking seriously



and develop his speed and condition on the road. We look forward to watching his progress at Middle Park this winter.

Mya, now in her third year with the VRWC and one of the toughest competitors in the country, has built impressively upon her natural speed with improved endurance and tactical know-how through consistent racing in LAVic and AVSL competition. In Adelaide she put it all together in the U13 championship to rip 23 secs from her PB, winning in 6:41.07. Mya is making her first forays into longer distances which, done sensibly, will assist her overall growth as a walker over time.

Congratulations, Max and Mya ... wishing you both a highly successful 2024.

- Rain Langford (SA) another big step up in SARWC competition, this time a 3:04 PB over 4km in 20:30.
- Abby Fowler (VIC) a great display of finishing speed to win the 1km event and handicap in 6:25 at Middle Park.
- Callum Martin (NSW) another big improver at the national Little Athletics titles, winning the U13 1500m race with a 15 sec PB in 6:30.11.



Coles Australia Little Athletics c'ships, 27/28 April - Adelaide SA

Two weeks ago, the Australian Little Athletics T&F titles were held at Mile End stadium in Adelaide, with 1500m Walk championships contested in the U13, U14 and U15 age groups. It was a rich harvest for Victoria, with three golds and two silvers, while NSW also claimed three titles with sub-7:00 wins.

Max Davidson (VIC) had the fastest time of the meet with 6:19.63, while Callum Martin (NSW), two years younger, gave further notice of his promise with a time only 11secs slower than Max's. Mya McClure (VIC), Sophie Polkinghorne (NSW) and Sarah Holmes (VIC) dominated their events, while Alexander Braendle (NSW) outlasted Victoria's Jaime Hvalica in what appears to have been a closer contest.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

PORTUGAL: 31st Grande Premio Internacional de Rio Maior (WA Gold), 11 May - Rio Maior

After a recent solid schedule of international racing – including a world teams championship - the latest World Walking Tour Gold in Rio Maior meeting saw understandably reduced fields as the main players switch focus from racing to preparation for the Paris Olympics. The 20km main event saw Ecuador's Brian Pintado hit back after his Antalya disappointment, while Peru's Kimberly Garcia Leon won in what appeared to be little more than a threshold session. **Paul Warburton** reports:

Pintado and Garcia triumph in Rio Maior

There were comfortable wins for **Brian Pintado** and **Kimberly Garcia** at the Grande Prémio Internacional de Rio Maior on Saturday (11) – the latest Gold stop of the **World Athletics Race Walking Tour**. In fact, the staggered start of the men's and women's 20km saw both cross the finish line in the same minute.

Pintado, the defending champion, was away and gone long before 15km. It also brought a welcome return to racing following disqualification at the World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships Antalya 24. But Garcia had Mexico's **Alejandra Ortega** for company right up to the last one-kilometre circuit.

It was a warm 19C despite the early evening start, but was to get cooler. 2022 double world champion Garcia was hard to spot at the start, wearing long black socks, black kinaesthetic tape from knee to glute muscles and topped off with dark glasses. She also modestly hung back at the 6pm start. In fact, the Peruvian was content to leave three others to take it on with home hope **Vitoria Oliveira** leading the charge.

Not that it was a particularly hard task. The opening kilometre was a pedestrian 4:43 and when Mexico's **Valeria Ortuno** and **Erica Sena** went through the line for the second lap in 9:10, it was clear things were warming up. One lap later, and the first four were walking single file. Surprisingly, Garcia was six seconds behind Ortuno at the front, but that slight gap was coming down inch by inch.

The status quo was preserved at quarter distance reached in 22:49. Shortly after 4km, Garcia ominously drew alongside Oliveira with the other two a couple of seconds ahead.

Ortega was moving though the gears and soon changed the look of the leaders. She actually passed 10km first in 45:51 although Garcia, Oliveira and Sena were treading on her heels as Ortuno began to suffer. It remained the same through the next four laps, but at 15km Oliveira's brave bid for glory was done.

It was now a three-woman race between Garcia, Sena and Ortega, but not for long. By 17km, 39-year-old Sena felt the increased pace and was forced to give way. With two circuits left, the Brazilian knew third would have to do, but up front the battle for first was still very much on – or so it seemed. There was very much a feeling the world's No.1 ranked race walker was biding her time after three big races in a little over a month.

And so it proved. Garcia did just enough to come home in **1:30:35** with Ortega five seconds back. The Mexican was a lowly 30th in Podebrady in April and ninth last week in Warsaw, but took second place here in a season's best of **1:30:40**. Sena was a distant third in **1:31:17** while Hungary's **Rita Recei** just inched ahead of a tiring Oliveira for fourth.

In the men's race, five went through the first kilometre and a blanket would have covered cover the lot. **Marc Tur**, **Jeferson Segura**, **Mazlum Demir** and **Pablo Rodriguez** were slightly ahead of Pintado at a steady four minutes plus for each 1km lap, although that slowed to 12:12 when they went through 3km.

At 5km, Turkey's Demir was content to hang off the back by a second, but it was shoulder to shoulder for the other four leaders. The pace, rather than speeding up, was slowing ever so slightly that saw the five through a sixth lap in a comfortable 24:28.

That all changed at 8km. Segura from Mexico sensed his chance to make the podium, so he and Pintado went away leaving the other three in their wake. Out of the blue, Segura suddenly called it a day just before 10km but it was hammer down for the eventual winner. Pintado reached halfway in 40:22 and quickly found 16 seconds on the three chasers that included Tur from Spain, Peru's Rodriguez and Demir. The Ecuadorean pushed on to double the gap by 14km although behind him chinks of evening light appeared between Rodriguez, Tur and Demir as they battled for the places.

Pintado hit his watch at 1:00:05 for 15km. Rodriguez was now 38 seconds back; Tur added another two to the deficit, and Demir was six seconds behind the Spaniard. That battle for second and third was done and dusted on lap 18 with Rodriguez forging an 11-second gap over Tur, and Demir losing time hand over fist.

Pintado went through the gears over the last two kilometres to come home in 1:19:57. It might have been a few seconds quicker had he not stopped to wrestle with an Ecuadoran flag he attempted to drape over his shoulders as he strolled through the line. Rodriguez finished in 1:20:47, Tur in 1:21:09 and Demir a distant 1:22:11.
