## \*\*WALKER OF THE WEEK\*\*



Round 4 of AVSL saw some impressive walking from our younger members, particularly in the 3000m. This week, **Ela Uzun** and **Logan Allison (VIC)** share the WOTW award for especially eyecatching performances at Murrumbeena on Saturday.

Ela, with her PB time of 13:11.5, set eight new records – four Victorian and four VRWC. Benefiting from a race-long duel with Angus Shuttleworth, Ela relieved Jemima Montag (U16) and 1992 Olympian Gabrielle Blythe (U18, U17) of their long-standing marks, cutting down her own U15 records along the way. There is no stopping her at present, and her appearance in the national All Schools at Lakeside will be keenly awaited.

**Logan**, 11yo, earned his share of the gong by posting by far the biggest PB of the weekend. Racing in an AVSL season for the first time, the young Knox up-and-comer tore 1:05 from his previous best

3000m time to clock **16:27.9.** Logan is one of Fran Attard's coaching squad and has gained attention as an attacking athlete who is keen to progress. We look forward to seeing more of his results over the summer.

Well done, Ela and Logan!

- Angus Shuttleworth (VIC) came to within 7 secs of breaking the 13:00 barrier in winning the AVSL 3000m with a 14 sec PB time of 13:06.8.
- Abigail Verity (VIC) a huge improver over 1km with a 36 sec PB time of 6:11 in the VRWC Summer championships.
- Caitlyn Shipham (VIC) an attacking performance all the way in the U14 2km VRWC championship, clocking 11:25 with yet another big PB.

# CLUB NEWS and RESULTS

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT ... 2024-25

It's been another successful year for the VRWC, in which membership continued to grow along with increased race entries during the Winter road season, compared to 2024. This followed two years of cooperation with Little Athletics

Victoria to raise the profile of the sport and highlight its assets and its successes. The falling away of numbers at senior, U20 and Masters level remains a concern.

The Club was represented at two international championship meetings this year, with **Rebecca Henderson**, **Rhydian Cowley**, **Will Thompson** and **Corey Dickson** maintaining the VRWC's input at the top level:

It was unfortunate that a hamstring injury kept **Jemima Montag** from the chance of repeating her Budapest and Paris podium successes in Tokyo. Happily, she has made a full recovery from surgery and is well on the way back to top form. In the meantime, congratulations to Bec, Rhydian, Will and Corey on their efforts in the green and gold.

On the home front, the Club's membership continued its steady climb, reaching 100 before mid-season. It's been several years since we've 'cracked the ton' so this was encouraging. The growth is chiefly at the junior end, with more youngsters trying their hand at road racing and, in most cases, coming back for more. One challenge now is to see this membership growth extend to older recruits, Open and Masters.

An area of concern is the thinning of the ranks in the mid-to-late teen years, particularly among the males. This is a trend that needs to be addressed for the sake of the sport's place at the top level of athletics. Girls outnumber boys even in the preteen age groups – as a glance at the finish lists from the LAVic State track and Road championships will show – and the gender gap widens as they move into and beyond adolescence. The recent Victorian All Schools U17-U18-U20 5000m championship had just one boys' entrant (there were 3 girls). While it's expected that interest will wane as teenagers' lives get busier, it's in the interest of not just the walking community but of state and national athletics as a whole to work together to turn around the drop-off in young male participation and progression.

We saw race attendances in the 30's -40's on most weekends across the winter. As a result of the larger fields, the Time and Handicap points competitions saw close contests in several age divisions. Encouragingly, numbers did not fall away sharply with the end of the Points comps in August.

June also saw a much healthier VRWC attendance than last year at the LBG Walks Carnival in Canberra, with our Club finishing five teams compared to just one in 2024. Regrettably, the decision by Australian Athletics to tie a Junior road walks championship in with the national cross-country titles in Ballarat this year and to lock this in until at least 2027 has probably sounded the death knell for the Race Walking Australia road championships (held successfully by us at Middle Park last year), as AA will not countenance any inclusion of Open, Masters or Under 10 on their program and will not communicate with RWA on the matter.

Our judging resources were augmented this year with the addition of two new judges (both of them parents) to the panel. This enabled us to make more frequent use of the favoured 2km course for longer races. The Club continued to promote judging through education sessions and offered opportunities to 'shadow' experienced judges with the aim of clarifying correct practice, as well as dispelling doubts and inaccurate notions on the way to gaining proficiency at this indispensable role. Again, valuable liaison with LAVic has reaped benefits in this area. Stu Cooper and international judge Zoe Eastwood-Bryson both conducted judge education sessions for Little Athletics personnel during the year.

The need for more coaches is no less crucial, at all levels, and more challenging to address. Club coach Mark Donahoo's development of a coach training model for Levels 2 and 3 and its acceptance by AV and AA were important steps in the right direction. Mark conducted coach education sessions in Brisbane and locally which were well received, as well as two pre-race clinics for walkers during the season. One aim is to compile a data base of active walk coaches at all levels across the state, to whom aspiring walkers can be referred if they have no current coach.

The VRWC's engagement with LAVic continues and the lines of communication are well set, with the LAVic Winter Road walk championships now an ongoing fixture and summer clinics successfully commenced at Mentone. Promotion of the sport and the Club at school level (through such agencies as School Sport Victoria) is an initiative we have yet to investigate. With our improved profile among the LAVic community, the schools are a potentially rich recruiting ground publicise the sport and the Club there and be confident of providing coaching and judging assistance.

Little investigation has been done as yet in regard to senior and Masters recruiting. Yet here there is also fertile ground, particularly among older track 'n' field athletes, those carrying injuries that have curtailed running, and players

of other sports looking for a new challenge. A leafleting campaign begun a few years ago had little success, but further efforts along these lines should be made.

Off the course, the Club needs new blood at committee level. Fresh ideas in relation to competition, officiating and the general running of the Club are vital for its future health and relevance. Happily, we've welcomed a number of new, younger adult members and their children in the past couple of years. We value the energy and enthusiasm they've brought in judging and race officiating, and we hope to add to their ranks next year. We hope, also, that one or more new members will find the time and interest to join the committee, participate in decision making and have their say in planning for the future. The Club needs you.

In closing, I offer my usual thanks to a raft of valuable people, without whose input the VRWC would be a far weaker organisation. To Terry Swan (Club secretary), Mark Donahoo (Club coach, Race secretary, Competition director and handicapper), Karyn O'Neill (Treasurer), committee members Terry O'Neill, Donna-Marie Elms, Heather Carr, Emilie Garside, Bob Gardiner and Michael Bodey. Also to Tim Erickson (Club Records overseer, historian, manager of the Club website and Racewalking Australia database) and Simon Evans (Club auditor). Thanks also to Donna-Marie and Gwen Steed (canteen), Karyn and Terry (BBQ), race day officials Ian Laurie (Chief timekeeper), Bob Gardiner, Kris Shipham, Alla Pashutina, Melanie di Benedetto, Duncan Knox, Deanne McClure, Dylan Shuttleworth and Gerard Feain. NSW's **Dylan Richardson** clearly has a liking for our racing programs, taking the Gus Theobald Shield to go with the AV all-comers gold he won in the State 15km title in August. Using the race in company with **Rhydian Cowley, Bec Henderson, Declan Tingay** and a fit, recovered **Jemima Montag** as preparation for the AA Marathon Walk championship in Canberra,

Dylan decided to stretch out at 4km, seemingly determined to take line honours. Bec, however, had her own plans, striking out after 10km and steadily reeling Dylan back in, catching him in the last lap to cross in **1:35:39** to **1:36:05**. Jemima, Rhyd and Declan socialised their way around the 20 laps before setting off to build up mileage for Canberra.

One of them, 11yo **Anna Dubar** produced the only 1500 PB of the day, while **Megan Szirom** made one of her infrequent visits from Albury and showed she is still in cracking form. **Alejandro Stephens** used his first go at the distance as a quick warm up before racing 20km the next day.

## FRANCE: French Marathon Walk Championships, 16 November – Salaise-sur-Sanne

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

It was France's turn to hold national Marathon Walk championship, and **Emmanuel Tardi** was in charge of the judging team for their titles on Sunday:

I was appointed as chief judge for our national championship of marathon racewalking in Salaise sur Sanne (a small village, 600km to the south of Paris.

France had already organized racewalking championships over this distance from 1926 to 1930. The race took place on a flat road, the loop was 1km long. The Marathon Walk started at 9am.

The weather was awful. It rained very hard, and there were very large puddles. The rain stopped around 10:30am. Everybody started cautiously. **Madeline Degy** (for men) and **Moutard** (for women) led for all of the race. **Duc** walked with **Lebreton**, and **Rottier** walked with **Carré** for places 2-3.

Lebreton had problems and needed to stop because of vomiting. Carré stopped for a few seconds in the toilet. Duc and Rottier finished 2nd.

The Men's Half marathon was won by **Martin Gaudre** (despite 3 red cards and a stay in the Penalty area) and **Souad Azzi** (from Algeria) won the Women's race.
