A focused and diligent trainer, Angelina is gradually establishing a base from which she can strike out for fast track times and tackle the key 10,000m distance with confidence when the time is right. Angela will race over 5km in the RWA U18 championship next Sunday, and she will no doubt be after another big improvement against a quality field on the fast Aughtie Drive loop.



VRWC Club points results, 17 August – Middle Park

Cloudy but pleasant conditions greeted the 24 walkers who lined up for the final Points competition for 2024. With leader board placings on the line and the RWA carnival next week, most weren't mucking around, and some excellent walking returned 9 PBs.

Along with the PBs, there were impressive first attempts at various distances. **Brodie Welsh** stepped up to tackle 4km and clocked an impressive **24:48**. Newcomer **Oliver Crowl**, from Berwick LA centre, was a standout in the 'mosquito' set, trying his first 2km and leading all the way until pipped on the line by **Logan Allison**, both clocking **11:09**. Well done, both lads!







... and they come out swinging!

Most of the day's PBs were by substantial margins. **Payton Welsh** posted a terrific new best by 38secs over 2km with a determined **Anouk Morgan** only 4 secs adrift with her own big PB – both sub-12:00 efforts. **Eden Morgan's 27:31** for 6km

continued his considerable progress this season, while **Alejandro Stephen's 31:07** smashed his 'official' best although he's clocked much faster en route in a 15km. Personal bests would be rare occurrences for **Anna Wallace** these days, so no doubt she was happy with her 24sec improvement over 2km.

It was pleasing to see **Mietta Morgan** back out on the course after an unlucky run of illness. We've missed you, Mietta ... welcome back!

*Next weekend ...

This is the big one ... the marquee meet on the VRWC calendar for 2024. We have over 100 entries from 5 states and the ACT for the six race distances on the program. There are many highly-credentialled starters, tough club walkers and a wealth of young up-and-comers, all of which makes for a morning of exciting racing!

The races will take place on the Aughtie Drive 1km loop, which has proven its worth as a course for fast times. Following the race program, the Presentations will take place in the Main Hall of the Bowling club.

REMINDER: As this is a Race Walking Australia meeting, all walkers should wear their VRWC (or state walking club's) uniform. Bibs numbers will be distributed by your team leaders at the course on Sunday.

Officials (including judges) should wear their Walking club uniform jackets and headwear if you have them, or if not, your State athletics association uniform, once again if you have one.

By now, all entrants should have received an **Information booklet** with all necessary information, including race fields, start times and bib numbers. (If you've entered and not received one, contact Mark at neerims8@gmail.com)

Note that there will be **two Judging panels** in operation, simultaneously but independently. **Panel A** will judge the 20km and 10km, while **Panel B** will judge the 1km, 2km, 3km and 5km races.

- The World Masters T&F Championships in Goteborg, Sweden, have once again seen many Australians make the journey in search of medals, records and personal glory. Among them is **Heather Carr**, whom we all know as an elite Masters walker but perhaps less so as a runner. Heather opened her campaign in Goteborg with a Gold-winning run in the W75 2000m Steeplechase, clocking **13:30.21**. This would be a welcome result for Heather who was waylaid by illness at the last championships in Poland and missed all of her walking events. But you can't keep this lady down ever. Well done, Heather, and all the best for the walks! (NOTE: Full Masters results from Goteborg will be published in the next issue.)
- Dual Olympic bronze medallist **Jemima Montag's** fame is spreading further by the day, it seems. This time, she is featured in an article in the Kenyan publication *Pulse Sports*, under the headline '*Australian athlete hailed for the best sporting interview ever after bronze medal in Paris*.' The interview in question, conducted by the 9 Network, is included in a clip on the page, and if you haven't heard it, you should. Her comments about the difference between 'wanting' and 'needing' a medal offer a perspective on success that is refreshing. Furthermore, Jemima is committed to promoting sport and play for girls in the mid-teenage years in particular, and she reiterates her 'Play On' message here. Race Walking Australia Road Championships 2024 Sunday 25 August – Middle Park, Melbourne ** Preview **



** 20km Open

Restricted in Paris to the role of 'drinks waiter' for his Olympic 20km team-mates, **Tim Fraser** must have been like the proverbial caged lion. Expect the cage door to be burst asunder at Middle Park on Sunday. With the fastest PB in the field by close to 3 minutes, the title is Tim's for the taking if all goes well. **Dylan Richardson**, **Corey Dickson** and Tim's ACT clubmate **Mitch Baker** should fight out the placings.

The women's title should, likewise, be Lizzie McMillen's, with only Allanah Pitcher likely to offer a challenge. Lizzie burst into serious national selection contention last month on this same course and will take some beating. Sam Findlay seems the probably bronze medallist.

**10km U20

Bailey Housden and **Riley Coughlan** fought out a close 5km duel at the Oceanias in Suva, with the Queenslander prevailing narrowly. Riley will be looking to overturn that result over 10km on Sunday. **Sam McCure** will be in the mix as well, and the medals will surely be fought out between these three.

An injury to **Maddison Nash** has robbed the Women's race of an engrossing teams contest between Victoria and QLD, with the latter now needing only to finish its three. It could be an interesting tussle between **Mia Bergh** and **Lyla Williams** for the title, with **Ariana Pashutina** most likely to have a say in the podium makeup.

**10<u>km_U18</u>

Riley Coughlan and Bailey Housden are double entries, so the interest here is in who out of Kodi Clarkson and Sam Lindsay will claim the bronze. Kodi, a known fast starter, will make a statement early whereas Sam is becoming adept at wearing down opposition. Fascinating!

**5km U18

The season's biggest improver, **Angelia Legrand**, stands out as the likely winner here, being the only starter to have broken 25 minutes with nobody else close. **Milly Sharpe** is the pick of the rest, with several capable of taking out the bronze. The Team title should go to Victoria provided **Ariana Pashutina** is recovered sufficiently from her 10km

**5km U16

This race could see **Sophie Polkinghorne** punch through the 25 min barrier for the first time, and **Mya McClure**, who recently clocked **19:55** for 4km, may well join her. Of the others, **Emma Grocott** looks best equipped to take the bronze. It'll be another VIC/QLD battle for the teams gold, with the home team starting favourites.

While there are only two entrants for the Boys U16 race, they're both quality. **Noah Cooke** has a clear edge in speed over **Angus Shuttleworth** and should win, while the Victorian (who'll be backing up after the 3km) will walk his own race and aim for improvement amid a big and classy field.

**3km U14

Ela Uzun smashed Jemima Montag's national U14 5km record last Sunday week (though it is yet to be ratified) and will probably smash any challenge that comes to her title claim in this race. As so often before, **Mya McClure** will be the one to mount that challenge and she'll keep fighting to the finish, holding off **Havana Ali** for silver.

At last! A VIC/NSW teams contest. Victoria has the edge in numbers and will field two teams, but the NSW trio, led by **Hannah Hewitt**, will be determined to drive a wedge between the two local teams.

With five Victorian entrants out of five starters, it's just a matter of the order the Victorian boys finish in. Angus Shuttleworth should cross first, with Logan Allison and Brodie Welsh continuing their saga of battles behind him.

**2km U12

This will be exciting. **Stella Wade, Pippa Read** and **Addison Frenken** – all of whom have PBs well under 11 mins – should fight out the podium, while **Indigo Marshall-Moodie** could also challenge for a place if one of the 'big 3' falters.

The small field of 6 entered for the Boys 2km has been augmented by new arrival **Oliver Crowl**, who will provide **Brodie Welsh** and **Logan Allison** with challenging opposition. QLD's **Leo Hyde** is not far behind these boys on times and should not be taken lightly.

*<u>*1km U10</u>

On times, it's hard to go past **Payton Welsh** in this one. She'll face tough opposition from **Anouk Morgan**, while it's anyone's guess who will fight it out for the bronze. Another exciting race! Meanwhile, Little Aths champion **Fletcher Reid** will be the one to watch in the Boys' race, leaving **Dimitri Pashutin** and **Zac Anderson-Rule** to sort out the podium order.


TASMANIA TRWC results, 17 August – Seven Mile Beach
