WALKER OF THE WEEK

This week's WOTW focus is on last Sunday's AA Junior road championships at Victoria Park, Ballarat, where 35 personal bests were set. Cream of the crop were two new Australian records, set by Isaac Beacroft (NSW, U20 10km) and Ela Uzun (VIC, U16 5km). Needless to say, Isaac and Ela are this issue's WsOTW.

It was, of course, no surprise that **Isaac** took the U20 title ... but the display of speed, power and technical efficiency he turned on was one you'd consider yourself privileged to witness. I know I did. His winning time of 38:55 sundered his own U20 national road record, set last year in Turkiye, by 1:01 and places him in the top 10 on the all-time Australian 10km/10,000m list. And, at 18, he's barely gotten started!

Ela suffered a setback in her last attempt to break her own national U16 5km record at Middle Park owing to a stopwatch glitch. With electronic timing in place this time around she made no mistake, ripping 0:44 from her previous mark to clock 22:57, just 13 secs adrift of Katie Hayward's U18 record. One suspects that that one isn't long for this world either.

Congratulations to Isaac and Ela ... two exemplary performances from two exceptional athletes!

*Honourable mentions

- Noah Cooke (QLD) and Callum Martin (NSW) produced the duel of the meet, each clocking substantial 5km PBs in taking gold and silver respectively.
- Peter Charlton (NSW), Harrison Ryan (VIC) and Koby Irvine (QLD) no medals this time but each scored a whopping PB, Peter and Harrison by over 2:00 and Koby by 1:59. Call that success!
- Alaska Bremner (VIC) small in stature but big in speed and ticker, scored an all-the-way win in the U12 2km, an unknown race distance for her.
- Sebastian Richards (SA) another big result, blasting through the 22:00 barrier in winning the U18 5km in 21:47.
- Bethany Moore-Kirkland (QLD) stepped up to 5km for the first time and made a promising silver-plated debut with a promising 26:06, prevailing by 10 secs over Grace Parker (TAS) who had a 40 sec PB for bronze.
- Hayden Robertson (QLD) possibly the surprise result of the championships, taking the U12 2km title with a 1:47 PB time of 9:47.

AROUND THE COUNTRY



AA Junior Racewalking Championships, 24 August – Ballarat

A typically chilly Ballarat winter morning, with a clear sky and little wind, provided ideal conditions for the gathering at Victoria Park last Sunday of 76 young walkers from around the country to contest their national road championships, on a testing but generally fast 1km loop. Aside from the 30 medals, there was success aplenty with two new Australian records and 35 new PBs set. Competition was intense and the technique standard was generally high.

The photos here are a small selection only. In the next issue there will be a special gallery featuring a wider selection of competitors from across the program.

*U20 10 kilometres

The proceedings opened with the marquee U20 10km races, featuring four Australian representatives in junior international competitions. **Isaac Beacroft** 'allowed' **Owen Toyne** and **Marcus Wakim** to keep him company on the first circuit, before turning on a masterclass of elite level speed walking to smash his own Australian road record by 1:01 and stop the watches at **38:55**. This places Beacroft 5th on the all-time Australian road 10km list and 10th on the joint 10km/10,000m rankings.

"I'm probably the most overtrained athlete of all time for these championships, I've just come back down from three weeks at Saint Moritz – that helped out," Beacroft said in an interview with Australian Athletics' Lachlan Moorhouse..

"I went through the first kilometre exactly how I wanted, but the second and third I went a bit quicker than I would've liked to which took a bit of sting out of my legs. I know what I'm capable of so I just want to hit my own targets."

Frustratingly for Wakim, he had to cool his heels in the cone castle for 60 secs but still had enough lead over **Sam McCure** to clinch the silver in **42:40** to McCure's PB time of **42:46**, the latest success in a productive year for the Adelaide-based Queenslander.

Zoe Woods also hit the PB charts with a strong display to win the women's title in **48:17**, with team mate **Sienna Pitcher** unlucky to just miss the 50:00 barrier. **Hana Jugovic** was on her own for most of the race, showing good form to take bronze in **53:53**.

 $\frac{\text{*}U18\ 5\ \textit{kilometres}}{\text{The two 5km races}} - \text{U16 and U18} - \text{began together, before the completion of the 10km, making for something of a}$ 'Flinders St 5pm' situation at the start.

Sadly, only seven walkers contested the U18 races, which nonetheless produced one of the day's best results as Sebastian Richards carried on the fine form he has shown this year to smash his PB by half a minute, winning in 21:47. Max Davidson's presence produced a few sighs of relief, with his own PB result of 22:51 indicating that the injuries are behind him. Milly Sharpe was untroubled to win the women's race with Grace Beck another big improver.

The two U16 events provided the most exciting clashes, with Ela Uzun sticking like a limpet to the heels of Callum Martin for most of the way, finishing with a new Australian U16 record of 22:57 – she can afford to laugh at the memory of those pesky Middle Park stopwatches now! Martin, locked in his own duel with Noah Cooke, gave ground to the Queenslander by a mere 9 secs as both clocked big PBs. Koby Irvine kept his eyes locked on Angus Shuttleworth and finished with a PB by nearly 2:00 – impressive stuff if not quite enough to relieve the Victorian of bronze.

Bethany Moore-Kirkland continued QLD's strong showing despite never having raced 5km before, while behind her, Tasmania's Eva Parker replicated her Canberra success in June with another podium placing.

While it was a relatively quiet day for **Nate Appleyard** timewise, it didn't prevent him taking total command of the U14 Boys race. Behind him, **Leo Hyde** and local surprise packet **Fiete Diers** both raced out of their skins to take the minor medals with 1:00-plus PBs. Even more striking was the improvement of **Harrison Ryan** whose 2:10 progression was a sign of things to come.

Like her team mate Nate, **Avia Luketic** did what was required for a solid win, with strong showings coming from **Isabella Welch**, silver, and **Scarlett Nunn** who put WA on the scoreboard before turning around and racing with the U12s immediately after. **Willow Wheeler's** 1:30 PB would also have put smiles on Western Aussie faces.

Before Sunday, **Hayden Robertson** had raced only four times this year, all over 2km and all at the slower end of 11 minutes. Did anybody – even his coach – see this coming? A massive improvement of 1:47 to clock **9:47** catapulted the young Queenslander from obscurity onto the top of the podium with a convincing sub-10:00 performance, a fitting finale to what was a fruitful campaign for the Sunshine state. Hayden's co-medallists **Eric Colgan** and **Fletcher Reid** shared the same 2km PB pre-race, with Eric improving his and getting the upper hand on this occasion. No doubt Fletch will put that one in the memory bank!

Alaska Bremner – a newcomer to the 2km despite having two 3km championship titles to her credit this year – found the 2-lap distance to her liking and from the gun opened a big lead which she never relinquished, winning in **10:05**. **Stella Wade** refused to give up the chase, however, keeping the Victorian within touch all the way. **Anna Dubar**, whose first 2km race three months ago saw her struggle home in 12:55, scored her fourth big PB in as many starts to join Alaska and Stella on the podium with **10:39**, narrowly holding off a determined **Beth Cochrane** who also broke 11:00.

UNITED KINGDOM: UK Centurions Centenary 100 Mile qualifier & Commemorative relay, 16/17 August - Lewes

Thanks to **David Ainsworth** for these results, and for forwarding the link to this report by Steve Kemp, featured in the Lancs Walking Club newsletter. Centenaries of any kind are usually worth celebrating, and the centenary of a Centurions club even more so, especially one with the heritage of the UK Centurions!

A special commemorative Relay event was held in parallel with the 100^{th} Centurion qualifier at the Lewes track in East Surrey:

The Commemorative Relay Challenge attracted nearly 60 participants including 24 Centurions as part of the Centurions team, plus a further 2 representing their clubs.

Teams from the Centurions, Surrey Walking Club, Steyning AC and Tonbridge AC all completed the 100 lap relay, with teams from RWA/ Lewes, RWV and an open team completing almost another 50 laps between them. Some Centurions went on to do further laps as part of their club team.

*UNIFORMS - Remember also that all competing members are required to wear the current Club racing uniform (singlet, racing top or crop top), in order to be eligible for Time or Handicap points and to race in Club championships. The cost of each item is \$45. (Families: \$45 for the first child, \$35 for siblings.)

DOGS OFF LEASH

It is a Parks Victoria regulation that dogs must be on leash in all areas of the Albert Park/Middle Park public use precinct, except for designated off-leash zones.

VRWC members, supporters and parents who notice dogs off leash near our race courses or official/assembly areas should notify myself, Mark Donahoo or Terry Swan.
