** AV 5000m Open Walk championships, Saturday 24 February – Lakeside Stadium

Small but high-quality fields lined up for these two races, with the mens' race in particular producing extraordinary results. With the men starting first, **Kyle Swan** made his intentions plain from the gun, opening a gap on **Rhydian Cowley** that extended to around 70-80m and looking very much in control. Cowley, unfazed, gradually reeled Swan back in and took the lead with 500m remaining. The Glenhuntly 50km specialist then ripped a 1:23 last lap to win in **18:28.47**, a 33sec PB that sundered Jared Tallent's Victorian state record. Swan refused to give in, falling just 5 secs in arrears for a fine PB of his own, **18:33.63** which was also under the record. These were two world-class performances, speed walking at its best. It's a pity that virtually nobody – other than family and supporters – were trackside or in the stands witness this engrossing contest.

Third man home was **Corey Dickson**, in the form of his life, clocking his first-ever sub-20min 5000m with **19:38.78**. After an early duel with **Marcus Wakim**, Dickson's strength was the telling factor over the Collingwood man who also broke 20:00 for the first time with a 17sec PB of **19:56.98**.

Jemima Montag, although entered, was a non-starter, which left **Bec Henderson** to claim gold in the women's 5000m title. While the title was Bec's, however, line honours were not. France's **Clemence Beretta**, in Australia for altitude training and summer racing in preparation for her home Olympics, turned on an exhibition of speed to cross first with a new French national record of **20:59.70**. Henderson, who battled early with Beretta, equalled her PB in taking the title with **21:42.01**, while **Alanna Peart** continued her own journey back from injury by winning the bronze in **22:38.67**.

Welcome to Racewalk Australia

RacewalkAustralia.com is an unofficial results website which attempts to maintain a comprehensive listing of Australian walking performances done both in Australia and overseas. It is paid for, controlled and maintained by Kim Mottrom and Tim Erickson with help from John Constandinou of England and has been in existence since 2009. This is an independent website and has no connection to Racewalking Australia or to Athletics Australia.

Initially this website was used purely for VRWC results but was quickly expanded to include other results from around Australia. The rationale for inclusion is

- All major Victorian results, whether AV, LAVIC or VMA or from one of our 3 specialist Victorian racewalking clubs
- The results of any Australian walkers competing in official competitions overseas
- The results of all Australian championships, whether AA, LA or Masters
- The results of all official State Championships run by AA member associations, LA or Masters
- The results of ultra distance walks events, as certified by the Australian Centurions

Once that comprehensive list is catered for, the list bubbles down to other more minor racewalking meets throughout Australia. These may or may not get a guernsey on the site, depending on a number of factors.

Hence the site is not definitive but probably covers 95% or more of results.

What is race walking?

Race walking is a faster version of regular walking and is a recognised dicipline of athletics, included in the Olympic Games. It is regulated by the IAAF and judged so that you maintain a good walking technique. Points are awarded based on how fast you complete a fixed distance and rankings are produced both for Australia and Internationally.

Rhydian Cowley (VIC) takes the WOTW gong this week, following his riveting negative-split performance in last Saturday's AV 5000m Walk title. Overcoming a fearsome pace and lead set by Kyle Swan for 11 of the 12.5 laps, Rhydian unleashed a 1:23 final lap to cap off a last 3000m of 11:01 that carried him, not only past Kyle but also past Jared Tallent's Victorian 5000m record to set a new mark of **18:28.47**. A huge result and a timely one with a crucial northern summer of international racing in the offing.

Well done, Rhyd. A powerhouse showing. We can't wait for the nationals in Adelaide.

- Kyle Swan (VIC) gave everything he had against Rhydian and also got inside Jared Tallent's record
- Clemence Beretta (FRA) now the fastest French woman walker in history over 5000m.
- Corey Dickson and Marcus Wakim (VIC) both broke the 20min barrier for 5000m for the first time.

• Cooper Rech (SA) – an impressive 41 sec PB took Cooper under 25mins for 5000m for the first time.

VALE STEPHEN JACKSON - AA COURSE MEASURER

Athletics Australia is saddened to report the passing yesterday (26 February) of **Stephen Jackson** - a respected member of its Panel of International Technical Officials as a Road Race Course Measurer. Stephen did not recover from injuries as a result of a motor vehicle accident whilst returning home after the National 100km Road Running Championships on a course he had measured to international standards in his meticulous manner last December.

Stephen was a proud and passionate resident of Bathurst. Recently retired, he had worked until mid-2023 for the previous decade as a CEO in healthcare and IT space.

He was pivotal in his role as the LOC Regional Manager for the World Athletics Cross Country
Championships - Bathurst 2023. His contacts, knowledge and skills were crucial in the delivery of the event. Stephen was also the course director for the marathon events at the Sydney 2000 Olympics. His impact on the grassroots running scene were immense including through roles with Sydney Striders, parkrun Australia and as co-event director of his beloved parkrun Bathurst.

"Our LOC team are all shocked and saddened by the passing of Stephen. He formed an integral part of WXC Bathurst LOC. There wasn't anything he couldn't find in Bathurst that we needed, people, machinery or ideas.

"Our thoughts are with his wife Jenn, his family and the broader Bathurst running community. He will be sorely missed at the local parkrun and of course as the Race Director of the Panorama Punish," General Manager of the World Athletics Cross Country Bathurst 23, Richard Welsh said.

Stephen had since been studying, organising events and travelling extensively. His work had taken him all over the world - living in diverse places in Asia, Europe and North America. Stephen reflected upon his life journey often, and in particular his work in Timor-Leste for which was acknowledged with the Medalha Solidariedade which was presented by the country's President at the time - José Ramos-Horta.

Stephen adored his family, partner - Jenn four children, four grandchildren and his dog. Stephen recently reflected that he "had been involved in athletics - the non- track variety, ever since he ran with Deek in Canberra a long time ago."

The Australian Athletics Family extends its condolences to Stephen's family – in particular Jenn who remains in hospital following the accident.

BRAZIL: Brazil Athletics Walking Cup, 18 February - Vitoria

The Brazil Athletics Marching Cup took place this Sunday in Vitória, the capital of the state of Espírito Santo, on a 1 km circuit set in Mata da Praia. The main events on the program, at absolute level, were centered on the 20 and 35 km marches, although it was the first of these - the Olympic distance, where the most attention was focused due to the presence of the most prestigious Brazilian figures in the specialty, in an event broadcast by TV Atletismo Brasil, the Youtube channel of the Brazilian Athletics Confederation, and which made it possible to qualify for the South American Athletics Marching Championships, to be held on March 10 in Recife.

In the men's 20 km race, the usual suspect, Caio Bonfim (CASO-DF) once again won the Brazilian title, covering the 20 laps of the circuit which, from the images, seemed flat and very wide, in a time of 1:21:26, curiously, combining the titles of the Budapest bronze medalist, voted the best Brazilian athlete of 2023, with those of his mother and coach (Gianetti Sena Bonfim) makes 21. Caio said at the end that "this is the fastest Brazil Cup in history" with the next stages that will take him to the Paris Games scheduled for China on March 3, Recife on March 10 and Antalya on April 21.

In the same race, marked by a lot of heat, **Matheus Gabriel Correa** (AABLU-SC), currently in 38th place in the world ranking for the next Olympic Games (the top 48 qualify) was second with **1:22:38** and **Lucas Mazzo** (CASO-DF), in 48th place in the ranking, was third with **1:23:33**.

In the women's race, another athlete who has been in the spotlight both internally and externally in the main specialty competitions won, **Viviane Santana Lyra** (Praia Clube/Exército/Futel-MG), who is from Rio de Janeiro and trained by her husband Luís Paulo Ferreira Porto, finishing with a time of **1:30:53**, she who already has the minimums for Paris 2024. **Gabriela Muniz** (CASO-DF) was second with **1:44:01** and **Bruna Batista de Oliveira** (AABLU-SC) rounded off the podium with a time of **1:46:10**.

It's almost guaranteed that Brazil will bet on the Caio Bonfim/Viviane Lyra duo for the World Marching Team Championships in Antalya on April 21, with the aim of securing an Olympic berth for the new athletics event on the program for the next Olympic Games.

And since this, the Brazil Cup, is an event that counts towards the world ranking for the specialty, the requirements defined by World Athletics were fully met with the measurement and homologation of the circuit by the international Ivan Gomes Junior, an experienced specialist with a 27-year career in the field, and the performance of three judges from the WA International Panel, all of Brazilian nationality, such as Nilton Cesar Ferst, Bernardete Conte and the recently joined Florenilson Itacaramby de Almeida (our special congratulations), completing the team Lindomar Teles de Oliveira, David Costa de Aquino and Mauricio dos Santos Carneiro Junior.

In the 35 km walk, a race that will be on the program of the next World Athletics Championships, to be held in Tokyo (2025), victory went to **Diego Pereira Lima** (CASO-DF), with **3:03:51**, and **Mayara Luize Vincentainer** (IABC/FMEBC-SC), with **3:02:46**.

In the Under-20 10 km, the women's race was won by **Thaliane da Cruz** (PM Colombo), with **55:11**, and the men's race by **Klaubert Ferreira de Franca** (CASO), with **45:51**, in the Under-18 men's 10 km, by **Davi Bastos da Silva** (Estação Conhecimento Serra), with **51: 38**, in the Under-18 men's 5 km, by **Vitoria Silva Araújo** (ASPA), with **28:32**, and in the Under-16 men's 5 km, by **Kauan de Lucena** (ORGAMPI), with **28:20**, and in the women's 3 km, by **Mychelle de Souza** (ASCAPI), with **16:05**.

The event was organized by the Brazilian Athletics Confederation with the support of Loterias Caixa, the Espírito Santo State Government, the Vitória City Council's Sports and Leisure Department and the Capixaba Athletics Federation. Congratulations are in order as, in addition to the good conditions of the course and the logistics, it was an excellent day of promotion for the specialty in the region, with the participation of 80 young people aged 12 to 14 in a Festival promoted by the FECAt.
