WALKER OF THE WEEK

It's that time of the year when students around the country take time out from exams etc., to lock horns in their state All Schools athletics championships. It's Victoria's turn right now, with added weight in the results this year since Melbourne will host the national All Schools titles in December. In the walkers' vanguard will be **Angus Shuttleworth (VIC)**, whose performance in last Sunday's AV All Schools U15 3000m walk saw him take a huge step up to place himself in contention for the national title. It also earns him this week's WOTW award.

Angus, 14, has been a regular racer at Middle Park until this year, which has seen him pick and choose his races while focusing, presumably, on training. It's been a successful strategy, for his results have been impressive, culminating in Sunday's title race in which he ripped 50 secs from his PB to clock 13:20.25. This places Angus 4th on the Australian U18 rankings for the year and 7th on the U20 list. Certainly he'll have his sights on that 13:00 barrier when he lines up among a quality field at Lakeside on 6 December.

Well done, Angus. All the best for the national All Schools, and beyond.

performance at the Junior national T&F titles in Perth in March.

AV All Schools T&F championships, 26 October – Lakeside Stadium

Anybody running an athletics championship has to be ready for anything, and capable of some fancy re-scheduling footwork. Such was the case with the AV All Schools titles on Sunday, where unforeseen access issues, due to a clash with the Around The Bay bike rides, joined with heavy rain and thunderstorms to knock the competition timetable to blazes. Thankfully, the walkers managed to get their races (combined into a single start to minimize program disruption) done before the lightning struck, notwithstanding the wet track being hit by a burst of warm sun that turned the stadium into a sauna.

Another kind of lightning struck in the form of **Angus Shuttleworth**, whose 50 sec PB time of **13:20.25** for 3000m saw him continue his inexorable climb toward the upper levels. It seems that, for **Ela Uzun**, it wouldn't be a championship worthy of the name if she didn't come away with at least one record, and her **22:42.45** for in the U17 5000m (two years above her age group) saw her cut the U15 VRWC club record and threaten Jemima Montag's hold on two others. **Max Davidson** found himself on the receiving end from Ela this time but showed he is gearing up for another leap of progress, finishing just 2 secs shy of his winning AA road time set in August.

The U16 3000m showed that **Matilda Read** is regaining top form at an impressive rate and could be back to her best in time for the national All Schools in December. Meanwhile, big PBs were clocked by **Lily Lambert** (1:42) who has made notable progress over the winter, and **Harper Cassidy** (1:57) who'd raced 3000m only once before. **Indigo Marshall-Moodie** took a 39-sec slice from her PB in winning the U14 title while **Cruze Marsh's** tight duel with **Tate McQueen** saw him lift to another level with a 1:01 improvement. **Fiete Diers'** own PB saw him take his first AV title with **15:37.69**.

** ZOE EASTWOOD-BRYSON EARNS AA LIFE MEMBERSHIP **

In a fitting recognition of five decades of service to Australian athletics, **Zoe Eastwood-Bryson (SA)** has today been awarded Life Membership of Australian Athletics at the organisation's Annual General Meeting.

The honour marks a milestone 50th year of involvement in the sport for Eastwood-Bryson, whose distinguished career has spanned officiating, administration, and advocacy at both the national and international level. Over that time, she has been a respected presence on the track and in technical circles, helping shape the standards and professionalism of athletics in Australia and beyond.

Such is her standing in world athletics that next month, Eastwood-Bryson will travel to China to serve as a judge at the prestigious Chinese National Games – the largest and most celebrated sporting event in the country.

*The following Citation was written by Brian Roe for Australian Athletics:

Zoe Eastwood-Bryson first participated in athletics as a member of the Central Districts (later Elizabeth) AAC in 1976, competing in throwing events and has been actively involved in the administration, officiating and promotion of race walking in South Australia, and eventually across Australia and beyond, since 1980.

As well as her involvement in the discipline of race walking, Zoe has provided her enthusiastic and skilled services as an official for Athletics South Australia (ASA), and similarly beyond, since the late 1990s.

Zoe's first interaction with race walking came in 1979 as a result of being "a bit bored" watching longer events involving her then partner – so she picked up a lap board and stopwatch and began a to-date 45 year plus commitment to her sport and South Australian Walkers Club (SAWC). This has included judging, recording, timekeeping and holding office and the coordination of the judging panels.

Zoe was president of SAWC from 2006 to 2023 and previously held the position of secretary from 1994 to 1999 and also in 2002. As a result of her continuous involvement with the SAWC, Zoe was awarded life membership in 2005. As president of SAWC, Zoe ensured that the activities of the club were supportive of all members and provided an inclusive environment for participation of walkers of all ages and abilities. She remains judging coordinator and child-safeguarding officer.

Zoe had a significant influence on the process that saw collaboration between SAWC and SA Little Athletics (SALA) leading to a resumption of joint activities in 2017. She has assisted in officiating and providing instruction at SALA events over a number of years to provide children and their parents with insight into walking as an athletics pursuit – resulting in many maintaining their involvement with race walking into the SAWC and ASA seasons.

By 1998 it was time for Zoe to get even more serious about her engagement with the sport more broadly – gaining her first qualifications in jumps, throws, race walking and administration. By then she was a state selector and a competition announcer in SA. Very quickly there was involvement in national level meets and championships and appointment as a judge for the 2000 Paralympic Games in Sydney – her first of now many appointments to international competitions.

Zoe has officiated as a judge at Australia Athletics race walking events since 2003 and as chief judge on many occasions since 2006.

Zoe did not hold back on both gaining further education and qualifications and immersing herself in competitions at all levels. Her next international opportunity came as a call room judge for the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne, followed by a range of appointments in the call room and as a race walking judge for the Pacific Mini Games and other Oceania meets and championships

After being encouraged and mentored by international judge Bob Cruise through the various national qualifications, Zoe passed the evaluation to become an area (now known as silver) race walking in 2010 – serving on the Oceania Panel for the four-year period ending in 2013. At the 2014 evaluation, Zoe was advanced to the international (now gold) panel – of which she remains a highly regarded member in 2025.

This led to Zoe being regularly appointed to major international events as a race walking judge beginning with the World Championships in Beijing in 2015 and then the World Under 18 Championships in Nairobi two years later. In 2018 came appointments as chief race walking judge for the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast and as a judge for the World Teams Championships in Taicang, China.

Many other appointments have followed including two more world championships – Budapest in 2023 where she was the first ever female chief judge and Tokyo in 2025 and also the 2020 Olympics.

Zoe's commitment to training and mentoring other race walking judges extends from her home base in Adelaide throughout Australia, Oceania and beyond. She is regularly sought after as a judge for national championships and circuit races in Asia.

Zoe has previously been recognised with life membership of Athletics SA in 2018 and with the AA Platinum Pin acknowledging 40 years of service in 2020. Zoe was vice president of Race Walking Australia in both 2014-15 and 2015-16 and was awarded their 25 years' merit award service pin recognition in 2021.

She remains a regular attendee at national championships – in and out of stadium, is a current member of the Australian Athletics Technical Committee and was call room chief judge for the 2023 World Cross Country Championships in Bathurst. Zoe was the Australian Athletics Official of the Year in 2019

Zoe's service and commitment to her sport continues with a passion and provided the strongest credentials for her election today as a Life Member of Australian Athletics.

Spotlight on Maria Pérez : Women's European Athlete of the Year finalist

Ahead of the 2025 Golden Tracks awards night in Batumi, Georgia on 25 October, we put the spotlight on Maria Pérez who has once again been the world's dominant race walker in 2025.

Having also been a finalist in 2023, will Pérez be crowned women's European Athlete of the Year for 2025?

2025 highlights

- World 20km and 35km race walk champion
- European Race Walking Team Championships 35km winner
- World leader in the 35km race walk with 2:38:59

Spain's Maria Pérez has been in unstoppable form this year, winning all seven of her races over a range of distances in the race walking events.

Pérez gave notice to her form with a commanding continental victory in the 35km race walk at the European Race Walking Team Championships in Podebrady where she won in a world lead of 2:38:59 despite stopping on two occasions.

And at the World Athletics Championships, it was business as usual with Pérez defending both her 20km and 35km race walk titles. Seemingly impervious to the hot and humid conditions, Pérez won the 35km race walk title - the first gold medal to be awarded in Tokyo - in 2:39:01 by over three minutes before

And while Pérez couldn't quite improve her world record of 2:37:15 in the 35km race walk, the Spaniard closes the year with ownership of five of the 12 fastest times in history in the event.

What she said

*On winning gold in the 35km race walk

"I wanted to win medals in two races here so I am happy. I was aiming for the world record but the weather made it difficult. I want to thank all the Japanese fans - they learned my name and cheered on the last lap. Even far from home, it felt like home"

*On defending both of her world titles

"I have been to five World Championships and this is my fourth medal. I am the happiest woman in the world. I did not come here today to make history in women's sport. I just came to improve myself and not focus on the time."

Did you know?

Maria Pérez's first major title dates back to the 2018 European Athletics Championships in Berlin where she won the 20km race walk title at the age of 22.

After being disqualified from the 20km race walk in 2022 and missing the 2024 European Athletics Championships in Rome due to injury, Perez will have two shots of winning gold at the 2026 European Athletics Championships in Birmingham.

The programme in Birmingham 2026 includes the first ever iterations of the half marathon and marathon race walking events which will replace the 20km and 35km race walk events.

UKRAINE: Ukraine Marathon & Half-Marathon race walk c'ships, 18 October – Ivano-Frankivsk

The Ukrainian Marathon (42.195 km) and Half Marathon (21.0975 km) championships took place this Sunday (October 18) in Ivano-Frankivsk, in a day that also included the Ukrainian team championships for various age groups, with the involvement of physical education and sports institutions.

Ukraine is a country with great traditions in the discipline, remembering especially Vladimir Golubnichi (Volodymyr Holubnychy), born in Sumy, a city where until a few years ago, national championships were held in his honor, a magnificent athlete who won 4 Olympic medals, two gold, one of them in the mythical 20 km walk race in Mexico City, in 1968, with a victory "wrestled by irons" against the Mexican Jose Pedraza.

In the men's Marathon race, with four athletes lining up at the start, victory went to Serhii Svitlychnyi (3:04:49) while Maryan Zakalnytskyy (3:05:14) took second place and Ivan Banzeruk (3:09:50) took third place.

In the men's Half Marathon, the highlight was the victory of **Ihor Hlavan**, a regular at these events, especially over long distances, and a former medallist at the World Athletics Championships. He set the victory in 1:25:48, with the podium completed by the performances of **Mukola Rushchak** (1:27:25) and **Yevhen Soldatenko** (1:39:43).

In the same distance, now in the women's sector, our already well-known **Lyudmila Olyanovska** (medal winner in major international events) prevailed, completing the race in a time of **1:36:03**, 1 minute and 19 seconds more (sic) than **Olena Sobchuk** (1:37:42), on a podium that was closed by **Tamara Havrylyuk** (1:53:13).

In the Under-20 category, victories in the women's category went to Anastasia Falchyk (54:38) and in the men's category to Roman Tsemyk (48:14).

It was the first time that race walks over the Marathon and Half Marathon distances took place in Ukraine, which, by decision of World Athletics, replaced the 35 and 20 km walks and which next year, in Brasilia, at the World Race Walking Team Championships, on April 12, will be part of the competitive program and where the presence in the sister country of a significant Portuguese delegation is expected to be able to cover the aforementioned distances as well as the 10 km for the Under-20 category.


The dates for these sessions are Wednesday 29th October and Wednesday 10th December. The proposed schedule for each night is:
